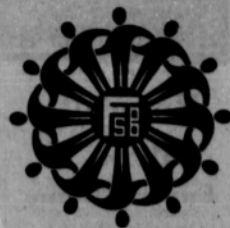


**OPEN HOUSE DEDICATION

The Spearman Lynx and Lynettes are now the undisputed first half district 1-AA basketball champions. Playing with the same enthusiasm as the state-runner up football team the boys and girls teams have just been fantastic, so far this year. Both teams canceled out their games, and all of the basketball coaches helped with the football team this year.

It was a momentum occasion when the Lynettes downed the Phillips girls at Lynx gym by a score of 2 points to capture their first half title; but, even more impressive was their big showing against the Canyon girls at Boys Ranch last Tuesday night. It is true that the girls lost the game by 11 points, but they actually lead Canyon by 1 point at half-time, and almost rallied to catch the Eagles in the final stanza. The girls must beat Phillips at Phillips next Tuesday night to win an outright championship, but they are in the drivers seat with their first half championship.

Lillie Belle Martin Bowling, 82, a pioneer resident of Spearman, died early Thursday morning in Hansford Hospital after a short illness.

Burial was in Hansford Cemetery directed by Boxwell Brothers Funeral Home of Spearman. Funeral services were held Saturday at 3 p.m. from the Union Church, where she had been an active member all her adult life.

She was born July 2, 1892 in Jack County, Texas to parents Bob & Sophi Martin. The family moved to this area in 1902, traveling in covered wagons. They settled first in Ochiltree county but later purchased land at Old Hansford and moved there in 1906.

On October 19, 1937 Lillie Martin and Arthur G. Bowling were united in marriage at Liberal, Kansas. To this union were born six children: 3 boys and 3 girls. Her husband and 2 sons preceded her in death. Survivors include one son, Leon Bowling of Spearman; three daughters: Lola Mae Cator of Gruver; Lela Mae

Ritchie of Grand Junction, Colo. and Lois Allison of Topeka Kansas; 8 grandchildren; 23 great-grandchildren; and 5 great-great-grandchildren; three brothers: Homer Martin, Robert Martin and William Martin all of Spearman; and a host of other relatives.
