## Voters will decide ... City supports new lake

A resolution to support a proposed dam in Hansford county was approved unanimously by Dumas city commissioners Monday evening, conditional on Moore county voters' approval of membership in a 3-county Palo Duro Water Authority.

The commissioners' resolution agreed to buy water from the reservoir that would be built on the Palo Duro creek in Hansford county.

Moore county voters, however, must approve a proposal to join the authority in an election that could be called for January, and then, voters in participating counties would have to approve a

bond issue of as much as \$50 million.

Funds from issuance of bonds would be used to construct the dam, north of Spearman, and to build a water supply system.

Details of the municipal water supply project were outlined by Johnnie Lee of Spearman, manager of the water authority which currently includes only Hansford county and a mile square section of Moore county where the Diamond Shamrock McKee plants complex is located.

"We feel the environment for the project is right," Lee told Dumas city commissioners. "The State of Texas is willing

to help us quite a bit with the project - probably with \$15 million to \$20 million in water development funds."

He explained that the funds could be made available in an outright grant to the project, by the purchase of development bonds issued by the district and in loans.

Dumas is the last of six cities to agree to purchase water from the authority. Other prospective customers are Sunray, Perryton, Stinnett, Gruver and Spearman.

Lee was questioned closely on the cost of treated water, which is now estimated at \$2.14 per 1,000

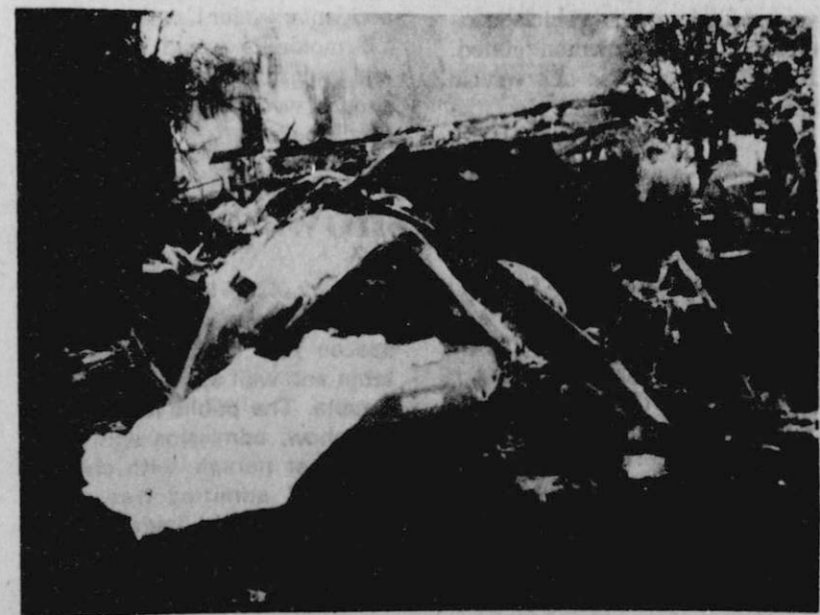


### Driver killed

Dead is Robert Jimenez, 26, of Lubbock. He was the warehouse driver who delivered to the local Mrs. Baird's Bread distributor in Perryton.

Trooper Ken Donahue said Jimenez was westbound on Texas Highway 15 when his truck veered right and struck a cement culvert 3.3 miles outside of Spearman. The rig continued traveling and struck a tree and ignited, burning the rig completely. Donahue said Jimenez was trapped in the cab. The accident occurred at about 5:30 a.m.

## Safety reminded for Labor Day

Major V.J. Cawthon, Commander of the Texas Department of Public Safety stated, "Labor Day is the last holiday of the summer, so many people will be taking their last vacation time before they settle down to school days and routine work." Some will take their last vacation ever, because of carelessness such as speeding, drinking and driving and not wearing seat belts, many will lose their lives during the holiday.

"At least 52 lives were lost during the last years Labor Day Holiday and 56 percent of these were killed in one vehicle accidents," Major Cawthon stated. Almost always these one vehicle accidents are caused by the

drinking driver or by speeding or a combination of both of these.

"We had 3,823 people killed in traffic accidents in Texas last year and 97.8% of these were not wearing any type of restraining device." If people would only use their seat belts at least 25% of these deaths and possibly as much as 80% of the injuries could be prevented," Major Cawthon stated.

The drinking driver accounts for 55% of all fatal accidents in our nation, so this is another way the motoring public could prevent accidents. Major Cawthon stated, "If motorists would slow down and not drink and drive, more people would enjoy the Labor Day Weekend."

**Local man involved in fatal accident**

A two-vehicle crash at an unmarked intersection in Ellis County (Okla.) last Saturday has resulted in the death of a Laverne, Okla., woman whose car rolled twice and burned after it collided with a pickup driven by Billy Duwayne Cantwell, 26, of Perryton.

Janita Elaine Wright, 33, died from head injuries at 5:40 a.m. Sunday in the Newman Memorial Hospital in Shattuck, Okla.

Oklahoma Highway Patrol authorities said the accident occurred at 2:45 p.m. Saturday on a county road intersection five miles north and one mile west of Catesby, Okla.

Cantwell's vehicle, a 1983 Chevrolet pickup, was westbound when it struck Mrs. Wright's southbound 1979 Dodge auto on the left front side. The OHP said her car rolled twice, then burned, leaving Mrs. Wright trapped in the vehicle for 40 minutes.

Cantwell was treated at Newman Memorial Hospital for arm and leg injuries.

**GTE adding new cables in Spearman**

General Telephone Outside Plant Construction Technicians are currently refurbishing and adding new cables in all parts of Spearman according to Robert J. Meyers, Operations Manager.

Activity is primarily directed to the west, southwest, and northeast sections of the Spearman community.

"The new electronic swithing equipment scheduled to be placed in service in late 1986 at Spearman is much more critical of the condition of the outside cabling. It is necessary to evaluate each one and do whatever is necessary to bring it within specifications of our technical standards," said Meyers. Special test equipment is being utilized to supplement the many man hours required for the job.

Growth in Spearman has filled many of the cables to capacity and new ones must be added for continued expected growth and for maintenance reasons. "Overall we are replacing about nine miles of cable which will provide Spearman customers a high quality of service," he concluded.

gallons. That figure is based on revenues the district would require to pay off the \$50 million in bonds to finance the project, the PDWA manager noted.

The project includes a dam to impound the 60,900 acre foot lake, a water treatment plant and 90 miles of pipeline to distribute water to the member cities.

Commissioner Jay B. Funk asked Lee if the water costs would be lowered by grants, if available, from the Texas Department of Water Resources.

"Yes, the cost will be less," the PDWA manager replied. "If we can make a better deal, we will certainly do it to bring down the price of water to cus-

tomers."

The Palo Duro Water Authority spokesman got support from Dumas resident Martin Gossett, who appeared at the meeting before Lee arrived.

"I formed an opinion before I got here - I'm for it," he declared, and urged city commissioners to "listen carefully" to the proposal.

In his presentation, Lee stressed the declining water table in the underground Ogallala water formation. The formation is the source of irrigation and municipal water supplies in the Texas Panhandle.

"From 60 to 70 percent of the irrigation wells in the North Plains Water district are present at the red beds," Lee noted. "When you reach the red bed, you are almost out of water."

The City of Dumas, however, is more fortunate than other North Plains cities with an underground water field that may produce 20 years or longer.

The field is located 11 miles west of Dumas in the eastern edge of Hartley county.

After passing the resolution to participate in the project, city commissioners touched briefly on a suggestion by Mayor Mike Salim to consider selling Palo Duro lake water to nearby cities with more critical water problems.

Baptism

I Peter 3:18-21 has several parts that are always good for a conversation. These few words can transform a otherwise sane calm individual into a raving, uncontrollable person. Yet I am one who believes that all Bible can be understood. Phrases such as "saved by water" and "Baptism doeth also now save us." My intention is not to ignore or pass them by, but to place them where they belong in relation to salvation.

In Verses 18 and 19 Jesus is made the single avenue for justification. Scripture says the just for the unjust. Only Jesus could ever make the claim as to being just. Only Jesus could ever claim to pay for some one's sin beside his own.

Major discussion comes in verse 20. In this passage what you must decide for yourself is this, salvation a spiritual or a physical salvation. In Genesis chapter 6:8 and 7:1 I find Noah was already a righteous man in the eyes of our Lord. Now what does a man have to do in order to be righteous? In Romans 3:10 Scripture says "There is none righteous, no, not one;" and in Romans 3:23, "For ALL have sinned," while in I Peter 2:24 Scripture states "Who His own self bare our sins." I personally must believe that Noah was saved before he built the Ark. Did not scripture say Noah a RIGHTEOUS MAN? We are only righteous when Jesus forgives our sin and makes us righteous. I can not in all of my studies find that the Old Testament saints were saved in any other manner than we are saved today.

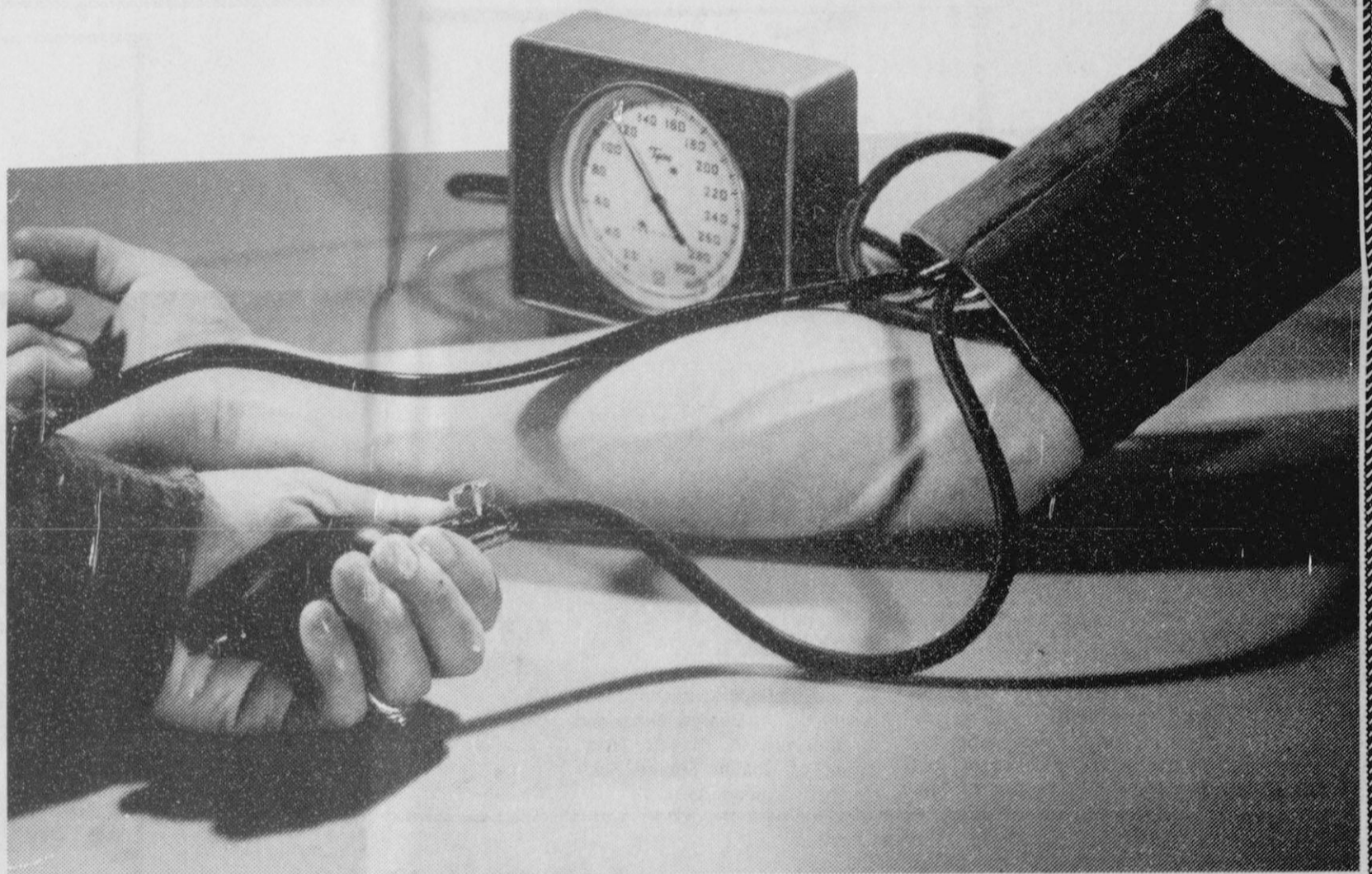
