Junior high names honor students

The Spearman junior high has announced a total of 24 eighth graders who gained honor student recognition for completing their primary education with averages of 90 or above.

One of the largest honor groups from any graduating eighth grade class, the 24 honor students are part of a class of 48.



Energy plant reps to seek revenue bonds

Representatives from Valley View energy are scheduled to meet with Hansford county commissioners at their first meeting in June to complete the second leg of a 3-step process in getting \$99-million in revenue bonds issued for the construction of a new power plant north of Gruver.

Over \$99-million . . .

The firm is seeking industrial revenue bonds which are finally issued by the state bond board. The 3-step process is required in order for the bonds to receive tax-exempt status. They will be sold to the public after the state industrial board issues final authorization

Tentative plans by the power company call for late summer ground breaking on a 320-acre site which has already been purchased by the Dallasbased firm.

While plans for the construction have been in the mill for some time now, the actural process has been slowed by government red tape, reports John Hutchison of Spearman, attorney for the Hansford county Industrial Development Corporation the local entity which has been responsible for attracting the firm to Hansford county.

Government approval for the power plant had to be received from both the Texas Air Quality Board and the federal Environmental Protection Agency before seeking the construction bonds.

Following the approval, the 3-step process began -- first with the authori-zation of the bonds from the Hansford county IDC. The Hansford commissioner's court approval is the second step which will be dealt with in the June meeting.

The third step of the process will be before the Texas Industrial Bond Board in Austin if Hansford commissioners approve the bonds during the

The new power plant could employ up to 80 people when construction is completed. It will have the capacity to produce up to 48.94 megawats of electrical power daily -- enough to services some 50,000 households.

The electrical power generated will be used in Hansford county, but through a trade out arrangement with both Southwestern Public Service and Texas-New Mexico power companies in Hansford county, the power will be arranged in a trade-off type situation with the city of Austin being the final recipient of the plant's production.

The Hansford plant is one of two being built by the Valley View firm in the Panhandle area. The other, is Deaf Smith county, will begin construction approximately two months prior to ground breaking in Hansford county.

Valley View Energy has joined forces with Southern Electric International, Inc. of Georgia to complete the two Panhandle projects.

Events on tap for the 3-day celebration include the annual Miss Hansford County pageant which will kick off the annual Hansford County Round Up.



A highlight of the 3-day celebration is a special fiddler's contest. Also scheduled are water polo, horse shoes, and more.



Voting for the Spearman Small hand to visit and coffee and doughnuts Business of the Year award will be the available main impetus of a week-long open


The week-long voting and activity will culminate Friday morning at an awards breakfast where the Small Business of the Year honor will be presented.

Gospel singing group to appear in Spearman


A special gospel music group will perform in concert at the Apostolic Faith Church Friday evening at 7:30., reports Lealand Grimmer, pastor of the Spearman church
