Test excavations reveal findings

thousands of years of prehistory as it meanders toward the Beaver River. When the Palo Duro River Authority hired archaeologists two years ago to survey the Palo Duro Reservoir area, they found a long and varied archaeological record exposed in the cutbanks of the creek.

Now the archaeologists, Archaeological Research, Inc., are conducting test excavations to determine if the sites are significant. If they are, then they will require further research effort to satisfy state and federal preservation law.

What they have found so far is sites that range in age from a Plainview bison hunting camp from 7,500 years ago to 700 year old Antelope Creek Plains Villager camps. Diagnostic arrow and dart points along with pottery and radiocarbon dates from sites and key alluvial strats have helped to piece together a chronology of local prehistory that may go back as far as 10,000 years.

Research is also being focused on the frontier and farm and ranch history of the area. Excavations at the old J.F. Andrews ranch up Horse Creek will help to interpret early ranch life. Architectural drawings of the buildings will preserve a record of their local and unique character. Oral histories from knowledgeable sources will help interpret early settlement. In fact, the Palo Duro River

Panhandle Archeological Group have been active with local digs and invite new members to participate in their activities. They are now assisting with excavation at the Palo Duro Reservoir. President Bob Fleming, along with the J effress family and Christine Goff, has worked for two seasons at the

Wolf Creek Courson Ranch Project, and has been helping with hand excavations at historic and prehistoric sites along Palo Duro Creek. Sam, Edna, and Autumn Gruver, from Gruver, have assisted with the excavation of a historic house foundation that predates any of the courthouse records. Mike Minter, from Gruver, has helped out in previous

seasons. Many local people, including Hershel Ooley, Bill Jackson, Hoyt Biles, Matilda Entrekin, Corky Kizziar, Richard Wagner, Clementine Renner, Irvin and Helen Bovd and Ernie Newcomb, along with many others have provided invaluable information and assistance. The crew of Archaeological Research is indebted to the communities of Spearman, Perryton, and Gruver for their hospitality and help.


