Blan wins division in 40 mile Okie Relays

Jerold Blan of Waka and three of his rival high school track opponents teamed to run in the 21st Okie Relays last Saturday in Texhoma, Ok. The Team, which called themselves the West Texas Running Club, consisted of Blan, Jason Richards, Brian Hughes and Mark Cassity, all of Stinnett. They took first place in high school division of the relays. The team ran the 40 mile race in 4:35.21 and placed eighth over all out of 25 teams.

The Okie Relays is a relay race that starts in Elkhart, Kan. and runs 40 miles across the Oklahoma Panhandle. The race comes to a conclusion in Texhoma, Tx. where the town is split by the Texas/Oklahoma line. The race attracts running clubs from as far away as Albuquerque, N.M. and Midland. Blan, who ran the last leg,

crossed the finish line with a time of 1:07.36 for his 10 miles of the 40 mile race. The race started early Saturday morning and Blan's team mates had to run their 10 miles in the rain. But when it came to the last leg the rain let up and "It was perfect weather for running," said Blan. When asked if he had ever ran 10 miles at once, the 1988 State 2 miler replied, "I ran 12 miles once in practice for the state meet." Since Blan ran the last leg and had to wait for awhile; combined with the early morning rain... he was "pretty nervous."

At the start of the race, the temperature peaked out at 50 degrees, with the wind chill probably in the 30's. The wind was out of the North; skies were overcast; and a light rain was falling.

Gibner Memorial Scholarship

Gibner scholarship given to Roper

The first C. A. Gibner Memorial Scholarship has been awarded to Charles O. Roper, son of Lovida Giblin of Spearman.

Roper has been very active at Spearman High School. He is listed in Who's Who Among American High School Students, is a member of National Honor Society, attended Boy's State, received the Governor's Recognition Award and was the Senior Class Vice President.

He played football and basketball for Spearman High School and is a member of Fellowship of Christian Athletes.

Roper is a recent graduate of Spearman High School. He plans to attend Texas Tech University in Lubbock and major in finance, banking or business. He graduated last Friday night from Spearman High School with a 93.5 G.P.A. The \$750 scholarship is open to

all Hansford County High School Seniors. The applicants are chosen on their scholastic achievements, financial circumstances, likelihood for success in higher education and overall moral character.

The scholarship was originated by the Spearman Chamber of Commerce and the First State Bank of Spearman.

Mike Schnell, grandson of Gibner and Executive Vice President at First State Bank said, "This scholarship is something that he (Gibner) would have been proud of. The scholarship helps young people who have the mental ability, but possibly not the financial ability, a chance to go to college."

"Due to his (Gibner) occupation as a banker, he was always helping people. And would be honored to help students today," commented Verna Lee Shirley, daughter of

Gibner and First State Bank of Spearman Director.

C. A. Gibner was a prominent Hansford County pioneer and banker. He came to Hansford County in 1917 and began his banking career in 1919. He was mayor of Spearman from 1948 to

1958. He was president of First State Bank in Spearman from 1952 to 1982 and was chairman of the board at the time of his death in April 1987.

Gibner was active in community affairs, not only was he mayor of Spearman but, served as president of the Chamber of Commerce as well. He was a charter member of the Spearman Lions Club. He was also a member of the First United Methodist Church, Masonic Lodge, Khiva Temple and Scottish Rite.

The Spearman banker was married to Hazel Lowel in 1925 in Spearman.

The Hansford Activity Center (formerly the Hansford Y) regretfully would like to inform the public that the swimming pool will not be opened on June 4 as originally planned.

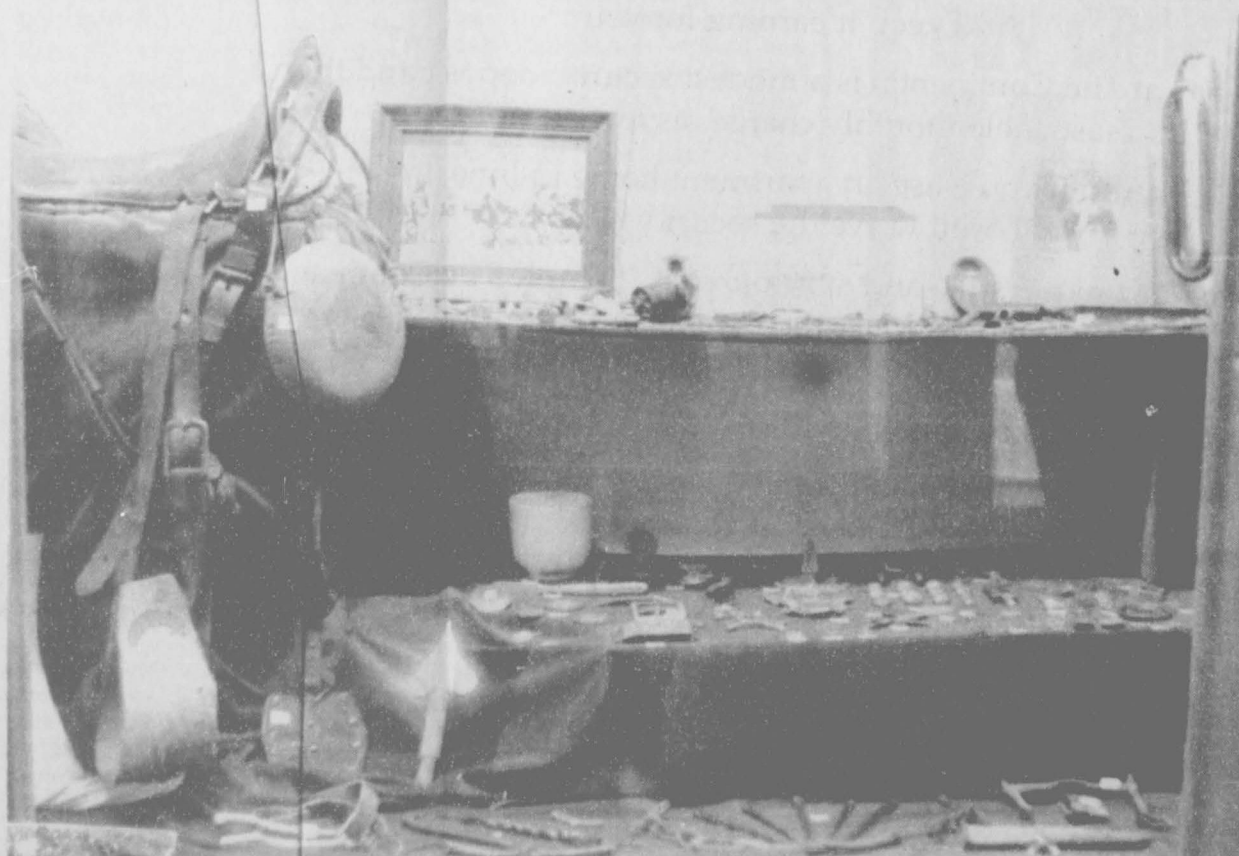
Janice Mayfield, manager of the pool, noted that there has been a delay in the certification of the pool lifeguards, but the pool is expected to be opened on June 7.

UP WITH AGRICULTURE

We recently completed judging about 8,000 entries in our annual Up With Agriculture Writing Contest, and once again our young people presented impressive viewpoints on the future of agriculture and country life.

Most of the entrants were realistic about the condition of agriculture. They wrote of the struggles that farmers have faced in recent years... and what lessons they've learned from these experiences.

Take the entry by Michelle Conn of Aurora, Missouri. She compared a farmer's life to the rising sun. She writes, "From the minute the sun begins to rise, the story of the American farmer begins to unfold. At first, the sun has quite a struggle overtaking the darkness, but gradually it begins to climb slowly into the sky."

Michelle says this reminds her of the obstacles farmers of the past have overcome. "And as the sun makes its climb another day, it is victorious, just like farmers of today who light the way for the future," she writes.

Or consider the entry from Brian Goodale of Pomeroy, Iowa. He says farmers are the most daring of all businessmen, writing that "Farming is more daring than most occupations because of the constant struggles against low prices and the weather."

And then there's Justin Brown of

Oberlin, Kansas, who says it takes a strong person to admit a mistake. "Farmers," according to Justin, "are able to admit their mistakes and correct them... and this makes for both a better person and a better agriculture."

As a result, he says, "farmers today are planning their production programs more carefully, marketing their crops more wisely and watching the bottomline more closely." He's right on the money!

These are just a few of the 8,000 views on agriculture we received from FFA members across the country. While each entrant presented his or her own unique perspective on agriculture, there is a common theme in all the entries: It's the love of farming and the determination to keep the family farming tradition alive.

Every year about this time, my enthusiasm for agriculture gets rejuvenated. I suppose it's partly because spring is in the air and the planting season is just around the corner. But I also get excited to read how optimistic our young people are about agriculture. Their insights are refreshing, and their enthusiasm is contagious.

And with people like these young people leading the way, I'm confident great things are ahead for American agriculture.

Round Up Tradition

The history of Hansford county is rich with the traditions of hardy pioneer stock -- the Texas Panhandle was still wild and untamed in the late 1800's when those first settlers trudged here to make a home.

They fought Indians, sickness, the weather and the loneliness that only those early pioneers could have known; shut off from neighbors miles down the road.

When an opportunity came for them to gather together, it was the only cue they needed for a celebration. And celebrate they did!

It's that same tradition which is carried on today, although in a modern setting and with up-to-date mores -- but it's the tradition of the old west which permeates the annual Round Up Celebration.

Those early settlers were separated by miles that could only be traveled on horseback or buggy at best -- and occasionally by foot if the need arose.

But the tradition of gathering together for a community social became established in those early days when neighbors were sparse and visits were seldom possible.

Things are a little different today. . . parades were slim in the early 1900's . . . the mid-way attractions had yet to become a reality . . . and beard-growing was frowned upon in those days.

The 1988 edition of the Hansford Round up boasts a good many of those same earlier happenings, though.

You can't escape the street dance or the air of celebration and relaxation which is a part of each and every Round Up.
