




Delmar Easley Services Held

Health Promotion Center Planned

PRPC--One of the newest ideas in the medical field is health promotion. If an Amarillo based group of private citizens has its way, the idea will become a workable reality for the Texas Panhandle.

"We're responsible for our own good health, that's the essence of health promotion,' says Eddie Melin, director of the Panhandle Health Systems Agency. The agency has the sponsored the health promotion task force since it was organized in 1979. Dr. Dan Loving of Dumas is the group's chairman. The center Loving and his group has been working on is a dream of the health task force. Through the use of private funds it would undertake an aggressive public education program to promote the benefits of good health and sickness

"We've never defined the limits for the center," Loving says, "because we don't want to restrict ourselves from the beginning." The committee has decided on some guidelines: the business at hand is health promotion, regardless of the form it takes. Public education in the schools, civic groups and churches; wherever there is a receptive audience, is also a major goal.

Eddie Martin observes that 'we're not trying to replace the medical community. Ouite the opposite, as a matter of fact, we're looking forward to taking some of the pressure off of the health care providers by expanding the health care system and by helping the private citizen to recognize health hazards they create health-related problems.

When the doors of the center open, it will be part of a unique club in the United States. As of now, there are few heatlh promotion centers operating in major metropolitan centers. Successful programs are located in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania; Cambridge, Massachusettes; and Tucson, Arizona.

Dr. Harold Daniel, resource developer for the Panhandle Health Systems Agency, has been providing staff support for the planning and health promo-




