#### REQUIRED FOR JUNIOR WHO WILL GRADUATE IN 1988.

The state law has mandated that students must pass both the mathematics and English language arts section of the Texas Assessment of Minimum Skills (TEAMS) test by the end of their 12th grade year to receive their diplomas. Students will have the opportunity to take TEAMS in both the 11th grade and 12th grade. If they pass both the English language arts and mathematics sections the first time they are tested, they will not be tested again. The TEAMS test will evaluate their knowledge of the mathematics, reading and writing skills they have been learning throughout their school years. The TEAMS test will be given to all 11th grade students on the following dates:

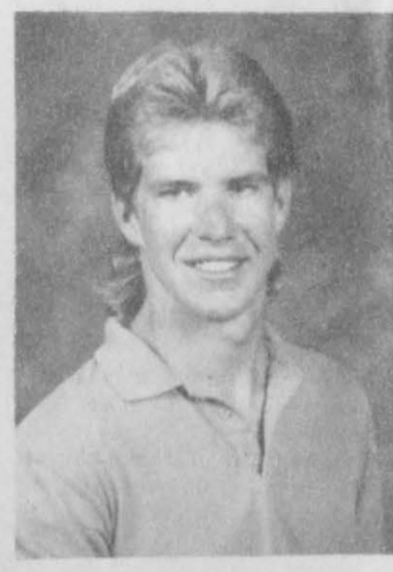

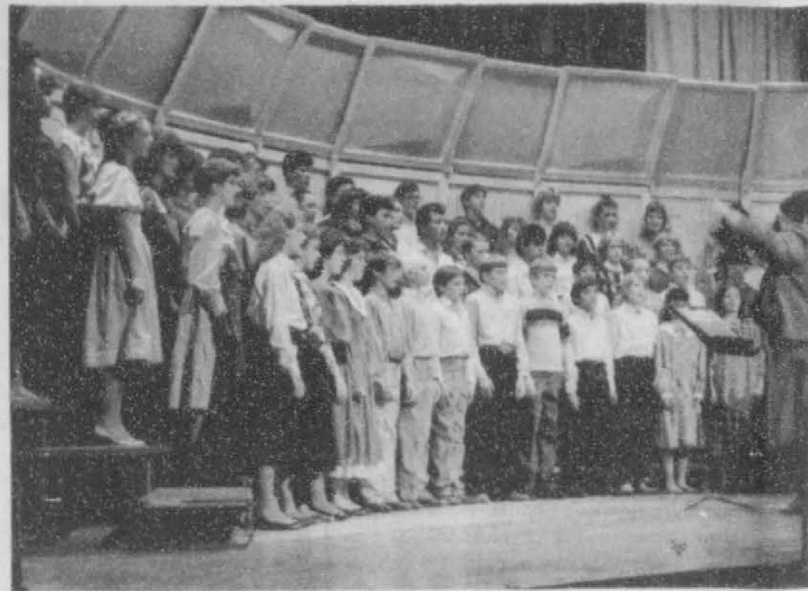

## Final Planting Date November 15

November 15 is the Final Planting Date for Insured Barley and Wheat in Hansford County, Texas, according to Jackie Harris, a representative for the Federal Crop Insurance Corporation (FCIC).

Insured Barley and Wheat planted by November 15 must be reported by November 30 in order to receive full Crop Insurance Coverage. The Acreage Report reflects the actual Acreage planted and reported by the farmer. "During the Growing Season, if damage occurs, notice should be given promptly," Harris said.

Crop Insurance based on actual production history (aph), is available this year to producers of Wheat, Barley, Oats and Rye in addition to Corn, Grain Sorghum, Soybeans, Peanuts, Cotton, Rice and other Crops.

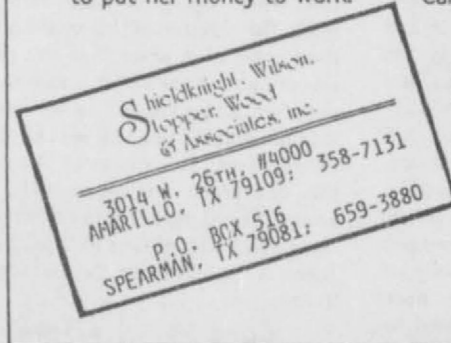


Construction going strong. This is the scene at the Hansford Manor as they are building the new addition.

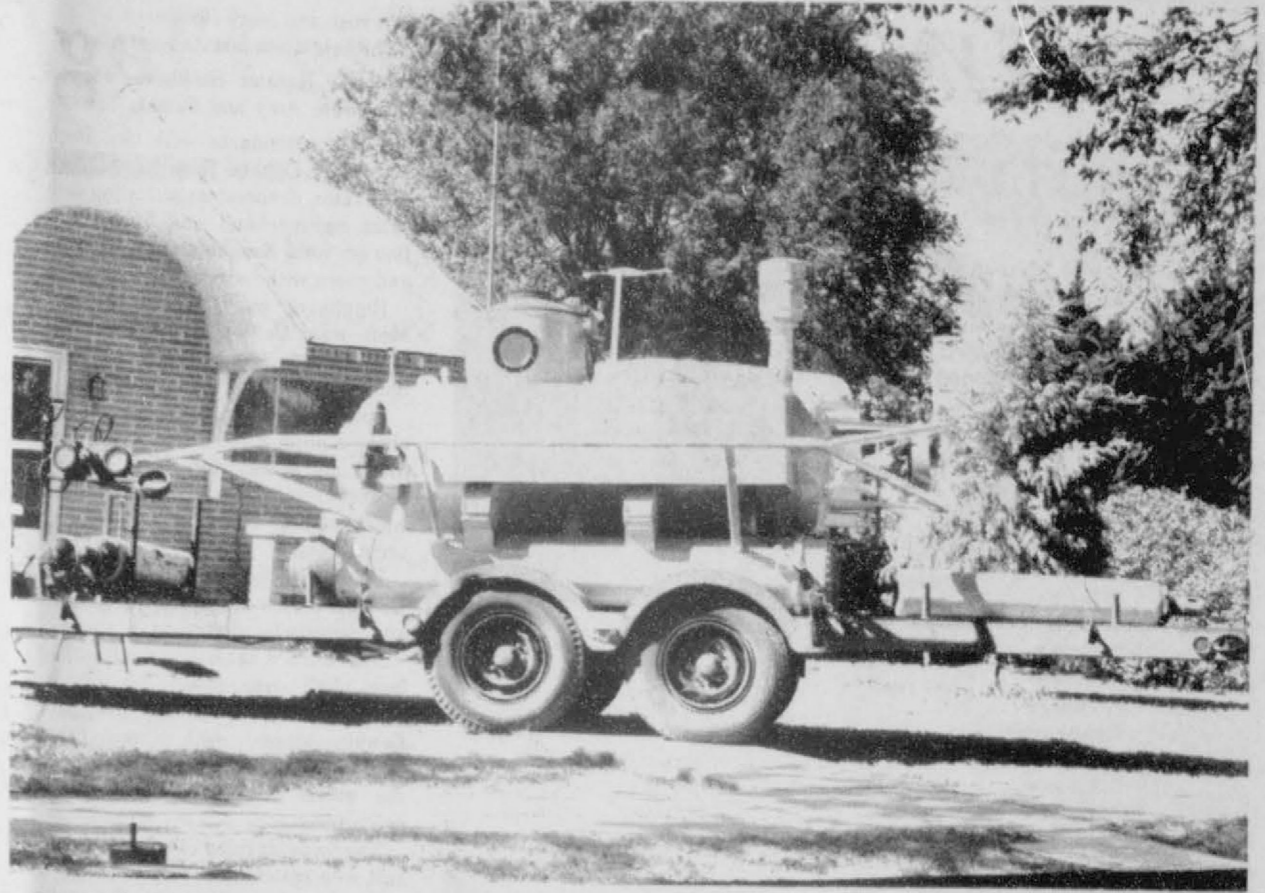
