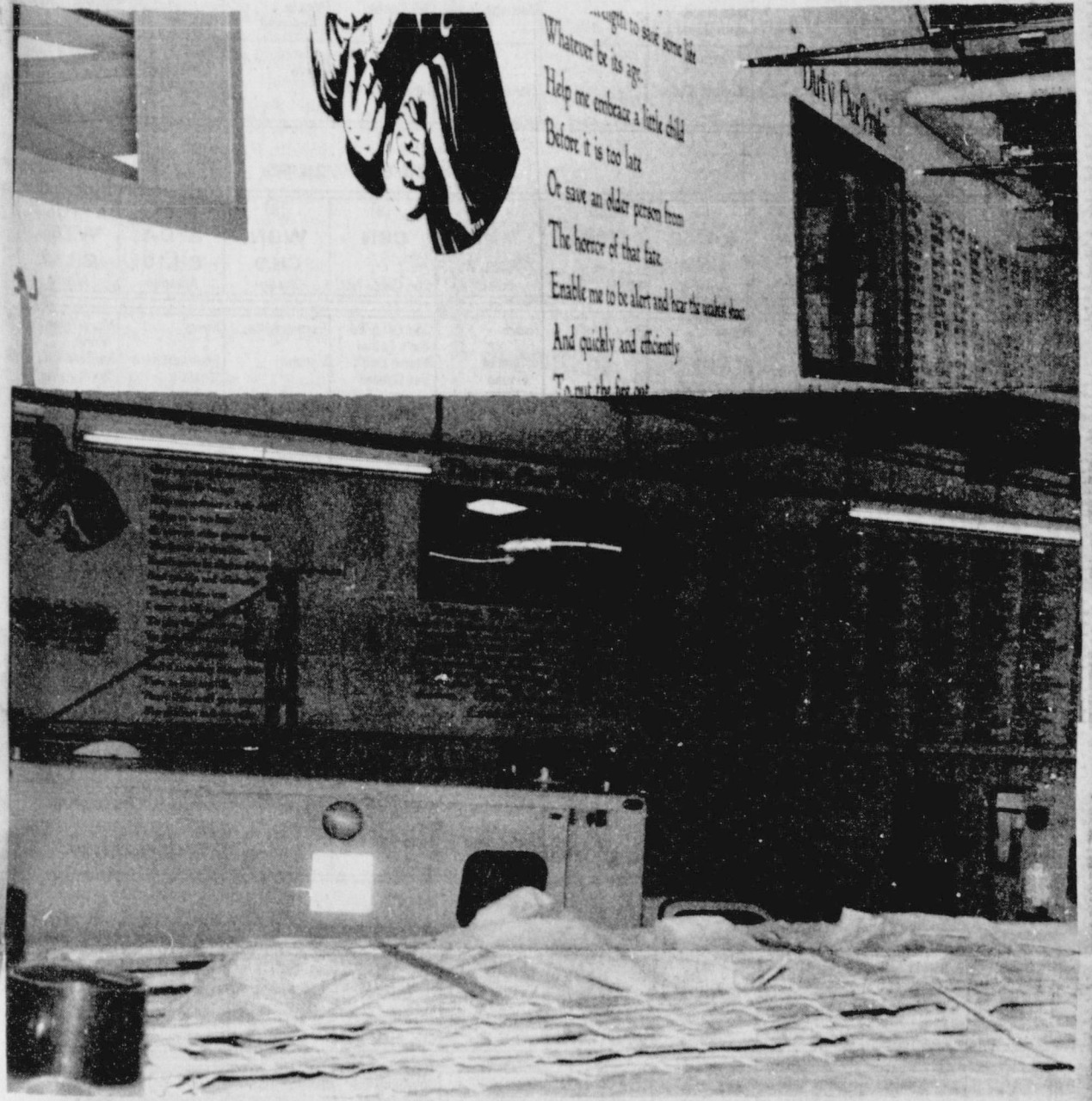

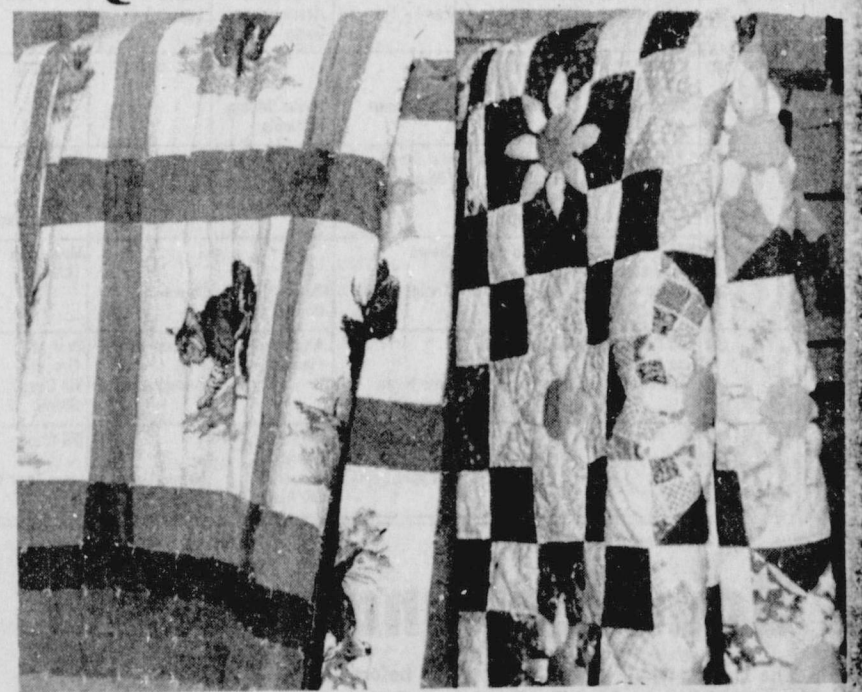
This Carnival is for our kids and we know that the Community will be supporting us in our effort to show the kids of Hansford County a fun time this Halloween.

Bullock to run for reelection

Texas Comptroller Bob Bullock announced Monday that he will run for reelection in 1986.

"Times change and we change with them," Bullock said, "but what doesn't change is the fact that the better the comptroller's office does its job, the better the rest of state government can function."

"The business of government, after all, is to produce results for the people it serves--and the Comptroller's office does just that and we intend to keep it up," Bullock said.

"While I have served as Comptroller, the Texas economy has gone through some powerful changes. But we have come through those changes stronger and wiser. We have never lost sight of the fact that government--just like all of us--must earn every dollar it gets and stretch every dollar it earns. "Over the next four years Texas

will confront financial challenges in its government like never before in its history. It will be more difficult than ever to keep state services up and taxes down. But I know Texans are up to the challenge, and I want to be there with them as I have in the past."

Bullock concluded by saying that he will "keep collecting every penny due the state with a fair and even hand toward everyone."

Scudder Funds offered

The University of Texas System has approved the Scudder Family of Mutual Funds to be offered to employees who participate in the System, Optional Retirement Plan or in Tax Sheltered Annuities. The Scudder Family of Funds provides a wide range of investment alternatives for employees who are planning for retirement. They will be able to purchase shares in the funds by payroll deduction and requests to transfer assets among the funds can be made by telephone.

According to Jack Selber, Vice President of Investments in Scudder... Houston office, the plan will allow participants to choose from nine funds including two money market funds, three income funds and four growth funds. "Like all mutual funds managed by Scudder, these are "no-load" funds," states Selber. "Participants will not pay sales commissions or fees for buying, selling or exchanging among the funds."

All the funds are explained in detail in a comprehensive information package designed to assist employees in making their investment decisions. The package includes a prospectus which contains more complete information about management fees and expenses. It should be read carefully

before investing or sending money. Participants in the System Program will be served by Scudder's office in Houston where a toll free number has been installed for residents of Texas. Professional Scudder representatives are available to assist callers at 1-800-445-0544.

The University's Optional Retirement Program was first started in 1968 as an alternative to the State's Teacher Retirement System. It is offered to eligible employees at the 14 campuses of the University of Texas System as well as to other State employees. Participants contribute 6.652 of salary in order to receive contributions from the state of 8.522of salary. Contributions are "pre-tax" and are tax-deferred until the money is withdrawn, usually at retirement. It is expected that the Scudder Funds will be offered later to employees of other state institutions of higher education.

The Scudder Funds are offered for retirement plan investments at more than 160 colleges, universities, and non-profit institutions. Scudder introduced the first no-load mutual fund in 1928 and today manages a family of mutual funds including a complete investment program for the American Association of Retired Persons

Can mothers who return to work still breastfeed their babies? Based on a recent survey of 567 employed nursing mothers, the answer is a resounding "yes."

The survey, done by Kathleen Auerbach, a sociologist, lactation consultant, and La Leche League Leader asked working mothers about problems they encountered with breastfeeding as well as whether or not they would do it again. Despite some obstacles, the survey respondents said overwhelmingly that it is possible to breastfeed while working outside the home. Many noted that they would breastfeed again regardless of their employment status.

Most of the problems the women encountered were similar to those shared by mothers who are home with their babies full-time. Fatigue headed the list, followed by problems with finding time to express milk and worry about milk supply. Dr. Auerbach notes that many of these problems can be prevented if a mother is well informed about breastfeeding.

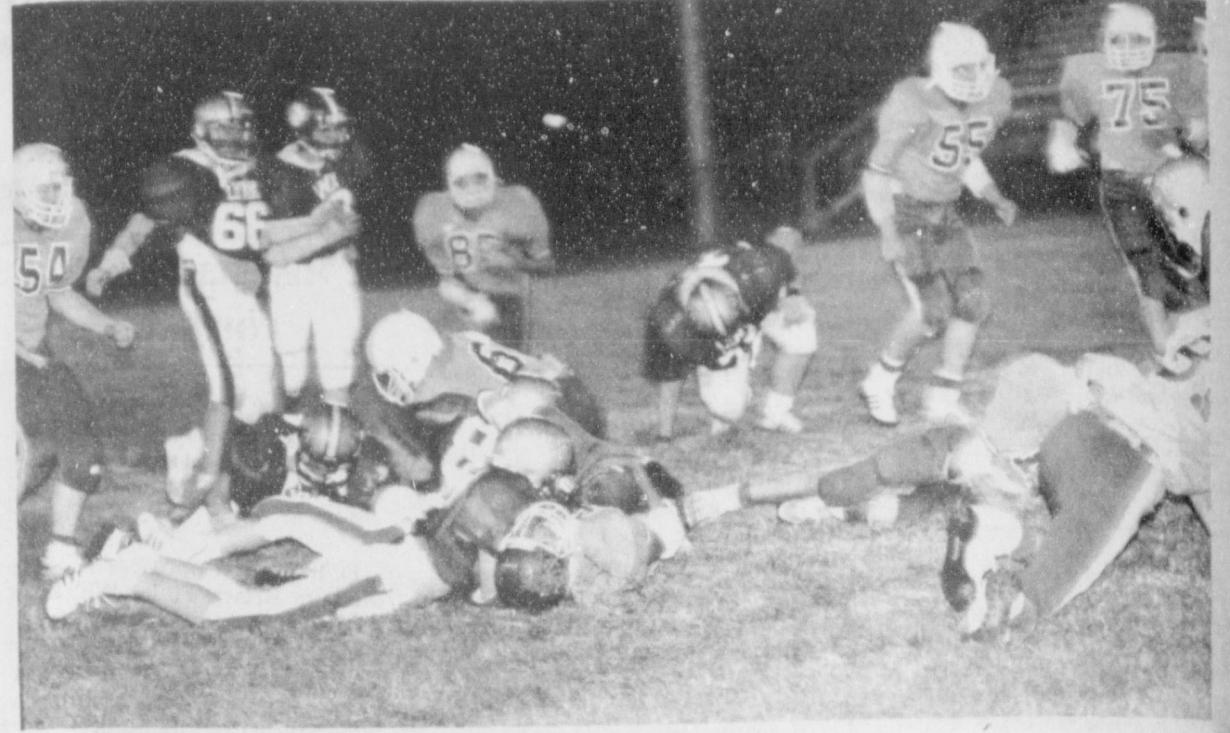

Environmental impact statement

Excessive drawdown has resulted from heavy pumping in the aquifer and records of more than 200 wells in the study area indicate that the average rate of decline of the water table is approximately 3 feet per year. Different studies have presented different aquifer depletion dates, however, studies of municipal wells in the study area indicate that the aquifer underlying communities could be depleted as early as the

year 2000. Not only is the water supply from the Ogallala aquifer decreasing in availability, the remaining water is of questionable quality as the aquifer becomes further depleted. 1979 U. S. Geological Survey study showed the water from deeper aquifers, containing large concentrations of sodium, chloride, and sulfate may move into the Ogallala in areas where excessive drawdown of the aquifer has occurred.

New Texas law

AMARILLO--Deadlines and implications of a new Texas law, known as House Bill 1330, were announced recently by Roy Johnson, Amarillo District Right-of-Way Engineer for the State Department of Highways and Public Transportation.

Johnson said that the owner of each off-premise advertising sign which was erected before September 1, 1985, along a road outside an incorporated city or town in Texas is required by recent legislation to register the sign by December 30, 1985, or remove the sign.

The new law refers to an off-premise sign as a sign which advertises a service or product not principally sold on the premises

where the sign is located.

Johnson stated that the forms are available in the Amarillo District Right-of-Way office, 421 S. Bowie in Amarillo, for use in registering a sign and that a form would be sent upon request. He also said that a 125 nonrefundable fee is required with the filing of the registration application.

According to Johnson, there are only two exceptions to the state registration requirement. If the sign was allowed under the Highway Beautification Provisions of the Texas Litter ABATEMENT Act or if the sign is in the extra-territorial jurisdiction controlled by a city or town, the sign does not have to be registered with the state.

In enacting H.B.1330, the Texas Legislature also authorized the State Department of Highways and Public Transportation to regulate

on-premise and off-premise signs which are erected after September 1, 1985. A permit for each such sign is now required. Permit application forms are also available in the District Right-of-Way Office, Johnson said. The telephone number is 806-376-5253.

"This new law is intended to promote reasonable, orderly and effective display of outdoor advertising along roads located outside the corporate limits of cities and towns in Texas," Johnson said.

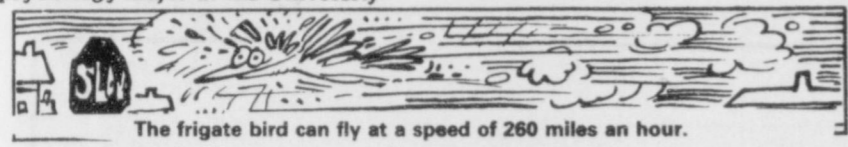

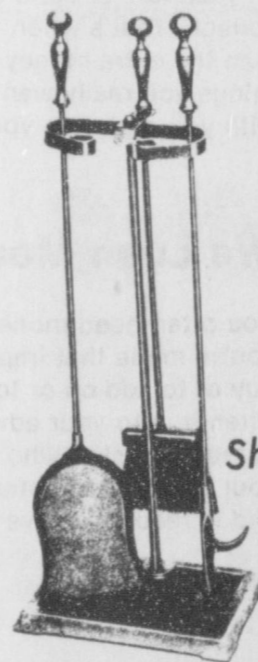

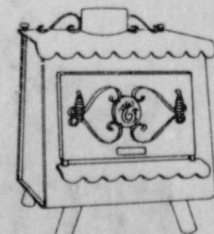
