



Scudder Funds offered

The University of Texas System has approved the Scudder Family of Mutual Funds to be offered to employees who participate in the System, Optional Retirement Plan or in Tax Sheltered Annuities. They will be able to purchase shares in the funds by payroll deduction and requests to transfer assets among the funds can be made by telephone.

According to Jack Selber, Vice President of Investments in Scudder. Houston office, the plan will allow participants to choose from nine funds including two money market funds, three income funds and four growth funds. "Like ali mutual funds managed by Scudder, these are "no-load" funds, "states Selber. "Participants will not pay sales commissions or fees for buying, selling or exchanging among the funds."

All the funds are explained in detail in a comprehensive information package designed to assist employees in making their investment decisions. The package includes a prospectus which contains more complete information about management fees and expenses. It should be read carefully

The University's Optional Retirement Program was first started in 1968 as an alternative to the State's Teacher Retirement System. It is offered to eligible employees at the 14 campuses of the University of Texas System as well as to other State employees. Participants contribute 6.652 of salary in order to receive contributions from the state of 8.522of salary. Contributions are "pre-tax" and are tax-deferred until the money is withdrawn, usually at retirement. It is expected that the Scudder Funds will be offered later to employees of other state institutions of higher

The Scudder Funds are offered for retirement plan investments at more than 160 colleges, universities, and non-profit institutions. Scudder introduced the first no-load mutual fund in 1928 and today manages a family of mutual funds including a complete investment program for the American Association of Retired Persons (AARP)

In addition to mutual funds, Scudder provides investment counsel and asset management services to individual and institutional investors.

Cowhide covers

Cowhide covers for the Major League baseball, which former Commissioner Bowie Kuhn discreetly authorized in 1974 to replace horsehide are produced at Tennessee Tanning Company, an operating entity of Rawlings, Sporting Goods Co. in Tullahoma, TN. The tanners there prefer Holstein hides which slowly simmer and bleach to perfection in caldrons teeming with secret chemical concoctions.

A tannery spokesman said Herefords make prime steaks but Holsteins make better baseball leat-

The qualities demanded of a major league baseball cover address its consistent thickness, grain strength, stretch, tensile strength

and resistance to tearing the 108 stitches that hold each sphere's '8' - shaped cover in place. Covers actually undergo inspection to guard against 17 potential deficiencies before earning the right to someday sail across a Major League homeplate.

The 'pill' or nucleus of each baseball, is manufactured at Mus-cle Shoals Rubber Co., in Batesville, MS. This red-pellet core, known as cushion cork, was introduced in 1926 and is enveloped within two balanced rubber coverings. The cemented surface of the

pill receives a series of three wool and one cotton windings. Rawlings employs a consultant to ensure the wuality of yarns, some of which derive form Dolgeville, NY., where Raulings operates its Adirondack bat plant. As each is completed, the ball is measured and weighed against a standard specification.

After being trimmed of excess tailings, the wound ball accepts a film of cement before the cowhide cover is stitched together with 88 inches of waxed thread. The seams are machine rolled for abour 15 seconds to compress the 108 stitches and produce a consistent surface. Cosmetic grading, measurement and weighing follows, with each b all required to be free of blemishes, measuring 9 to 91/4 inches across two seams, and weighing from 5.00 to 5.25 ounces. The baseball's circumference and weight have been the same since

After being stamped with the Rawling's trademark and Major Leaque designation, the balls are then shipped to a central warehouse in Springfield, Mo., where a statistically - representative sample from each shipment are tested for the Major League-sanctioned test to measure a basebell's co-efficient of restitution (COR. Rawlings currently is the only baseball manufacturer equipped to conduct the sophisticated test.

This test involves shooting the baseballs from an air cannon at a velocity of 85 feet a second against a wood surface eight feet away. The rebound speed is divided by the delivery velocity to calculate the COR. League specifications stipulate the baseballs must register on rebound 54.6 per cent of the original velocity, plus or minus 3.2 percent. They also must retain their shape after being subjected to

a 65-pound force and distort less than 8/100ths of an inch under compression. Such are the Major League demands for the game's official sphere.

Once shipped, about the only remaining task rests with umpires applying a dab of Lena Blackburne's Baseball Rubbing Mud. Then come the inevitable faceoffs between pitchers and battersthroughout another sunburnt season of Major League baseball where the Rawlings trademark will hurtle across homeplates for another 11 years.

Gas Well completions

Texas oil and gas operators reported 88 gas and 31 oil discoveries in September, according to Railroad Commission Chairman Buddy Temple. In August, a total of 73 gas and 46 oil discoveries were filed with

the Commission. A discovery is an exploratory well that is completed in a previously untapped reservoir.

Gas discoveries in September included two in the San Antonio area (District), 14 in the Refugio area (District 2), 13 in Southeast Texas (District3), 30 in deepsouth Texas

(District 4), seven in East Central Texas (District 5), eight in East Texas (District 6), nine in West Central Texas (District 7B), two in the San Angelo area (District 7C), two in the Midland area (District 8), and one in the Panhandle (District 10).

Oil discoveries included five in the Refugio area (District 2), six in Southeast Texas (District 3), three in deep South Texas (District 4), four in West Central Texas (District 7B), three in the San Angelo area (District 7C), four in the Lubbock area (District 8A), and six in North Texas (District

Those discoveries were included in the 1,320 oil, 349 gas, and 136 service completions operators reported in September. In August, operators filed 1,277 oil, 382 gas, and 116 service completions.

A total of 355 dry holes were reported in September, compared to 519 in August.

Can mothers who return to work still breastfeed their babies? Based on a recent survey of 567 employed nursing mothers, the answer is a resounding "yes."

The survey, done by Kathleen Auerbach, a sociologist, lactation consultant, and La Leche Leage Leader asked working mothers about problems they encountered with breastfeeding as well as whether or not they would do it again. Despite some obstacles, the survey respondents said overwhelmingly that it is possible to breastfeed while working tside the home. Many noted that they would breastfeed again regardless of their employment statue.

Most of the problems the women encountered were similar to those shared by mothers who are home with their babies full-time. Fatigue headed the list, followed by problems with finding time to express milk and worry about milk supply. Dr. Auerbauch notes that many of these problems can be prevented if a mother is well informed about breast-

Environmental impact statement

Excessive drawdown has resulted from heavy pumping in the aquifer and records of more than 200 wells in the study area indicate that the average rate of decline of the water table is approximately 3 feet per year. Different studies have presented different aquifer depletion dates, however, studies of municipal wells in the study area indicate that the aquifer underlying communities could be depleted as early as the year 2000. Not only is the water supply from the Ogallala aquifer decreasing in availability, the remaining water is of questionable quality as the aquifer becomes further depleted. 1979 U. S. Geological Survey study showed the water from deeper aquifers, containing large concentrations of sodium, chloride, and sulfate may move into the Ogallala in areas where excessive drawdown of the aquifer has occurred.





AMARILLO-Deadlines and implications of a new Texas law, known as House Bill 1330, were announced recently by Roy Johnson, Amarillo District Right-of Way Engineer for the State Department of Highways and Public Transportation.

Johnson said that the owner of each off-premise advertising sign which was erected before September 1, 1985, along a road outside an incorporated city or town in Texas is required by recent legislation to register the sign by December 30, 1985, or remove the

The new law refers to an off-premise sign as a sign which advertises a service or product not pricipally sold on the premises where the sign is located.

Johnson stated that the forms are available in the Amarillo District Right-of-Way office, 421 S. Bowie in Amerillo, for use in registering a sign and that a form would be sent upon request. He also said that a !25 nonrefundable fee is required with the filing of the registration application.

According to Johnson, there are only two exceptions to the state registration requirement. If the sign was allowed under the Highway Beautification Provisions of the Texas Litter ABATEMENT Act or if the sign is in the extra-territorial jurisdiction controlled by a city or town, the sign does not have to be registered with the state.

In enacting H.B.1330, the Texas Legislature also authorized the State Department of Highways and Public Transportation to regulate on-premise and off-premise signs which are erected after September 1, 1985. A permit for each such sign is now required. Permit application forms are also available in the District Right-of-Way Ofice, Johnson said. The telephone number is 806-376-5253.

"This new law is intended to promote reasonable, orderly and effective display of outdoor advertising along roads located outside the corporate limits of cities and towns in Texas," Johnson said.


