### LETTER TO THE EDITOR

To me this is a small world! My wife and I flew to see Texas A&M play Ohio State in the Cotton Bowl. We had no tickets, but an ex-Aggie said he had four. He sold us two in the end zone on the highest row. They were excellent seats. I asked the name of this Aggie and he said "David Britt". The Britts owned a ranch near where I was born in Wheeler, Texas. They were great people.

While I was in the navy, I had a chance to go to the top of Poa de Asuca, Sugar Loaf in Rio, Brazil. I asked a fellow naval officer where he lived. His answer was that he was the County Agricultural Agent of Wheeler County and an ex-Aggie. I told him of a girl I had dated and asked if he knew her. His answer was "yes". He said he married her.

I happened to have bumped into a soldier. I said "excuse me". I was R.D. Mason from Wheeler, Texas, a person I had known for many years.

When I was aboard the USS ZELIN, an attack transport, we pulled into Pago Pago (pronounced "Pango-Pango"). I decided to climb to the top of a near-by ridge. It was so steep I used a cable car track. No problem except when a cable car started down the track. I had to hang on underneath the tracks. When I did get to the top, I met a person I knew from Muleshoe, Texas.

When I applied to go to Midshipmen's school, I was transferred from the ZELIN to Admiral Halsey's office

force in Noumea, New Caledonia, while awaiting my orders. My job was to get "secret & confidential" mail to ships. One of my shipmates who left the USN training Station in San Diego when I did. Why? Because he saw 3 names on a list to be transferred. He erased one name and wrote in my name, hoping we would end up on the same ship. We did not. He went to North Africa. I went to the South Pacific. Later his ship pulled into Noumea. We got together there.

The Navy was so good to me. My wife's secretarial school gave the Midshipmen a dance party at the Hotel McAlpen where we met. After 23 months hauling oil along the east coast of South America, we returned to the USA, refitted to care for minesweepers. We got married. Then I was sent back to Okinawa and Japan before WW-II ended. I went on reserve. The GI-Bill enabled me to get my degree from Texas A&M.

## Texas A&M survey shows school teachers think evaluations ineffective

COLLEGE STATION — Most public school teachers in Texas think their performance evaluations over the last two years were unfair, administered by people who are not credible, and didn't weed out poor performers, according to a survey conducted by Texas A&M education specialists.

Dr. Tom Savage of Texas A&M's College of Education and graduate assistant Marsha McCord conducted a random survey of teachers across Texas and found some positive results as well. For instance, 77 percent of 205 teachers surveyed thought their evaluations



## Warning Don't blow smoke

(Austin)—The American Heart Association issues a new warning to all Texans: exposure to second-hand smoke may be hazardous to your health.

The Heart Association's warning matches similar findings released by the U.S. Surgeon General late last year. Surgeon General C. Everett Koop, M.D. presented scientific evidence on the harm to non-smokers of breathing exhaled smoke or the smoke coming from the tip of a burning cigarette.

The Heart Association says pregnant women should not smoke, and parents who smoke should avoid exposing their children to the harmful effects of involuntary smoking.

"The evidence on smoking or health has been air-tight for year," says Addison A. Taylor, M.D., president of the Heart Association in Texas. "But recent evidence strongly points to a connection between second-hand smoke and increased risk of heart disease." This is the first time the Heart Association has commented on the risk of cigarette smoke in the air around non-smokers.

"The Surgeon General's report is the most comprehensive collection of scientific evidence on the hazards of passive smoke," say Taylor. "The implications are alarming. The health of non-smokers must be protected. The most logical way is to restrict smoking in public places."
