but this may be supereceded if the Hansford County figures are true of the rest of
ihe state. An 111.1 million bushel yield is estimated by the Texas Crop and LiveTexas, this, the largest since the 11.2 million bush els produced in 1919 . Texas' record crop of 11
million was harvested in
1910.
Estimated yield from the Commissioncr's desk for the 1975 crop was 101 bushels pet acre which is a record for Texas according to
