their prestige Friday night by a big, tough bunch of Sunray Bobcats. The Cates gave thei new Coach Gene Offield a 16-14 upset over the Lynx. Sunray's fondness for a passing game and a holding penalty in the first half allowed the Lynx to leave the field with a $0-0$ Statistically, the Lynx beat the Bobcats in most departments but the scoring. Spearman had 263 yards rushing and 59 passing for a 322 total offense.
Sunray mustered only 140 yards rushing and 69 passing Spearman's Ken Shufeldt was the big running gun for the tynx as he rolled up 194 yards and two touchdowns in his efforts for the night,
