tion Act of 1965 following a tion Act of 1965 , r .lowing ac
ceptance of $\$ 375,095$ in fed ceptance of $\$ 375,095 \mathrm{in}$ fed John Connally Friday. The 10 month program to be financed on the funds is designed to allow educators to gather new information and technical devices for dissemination among the
101 school districts participating in the program in the 36 -county area of the Panhandle and South Pla ins. The new program will be labeled the Texas Coopera tive Dissemination (TCD) Project.
Canyon District was appointed School District was appointed the
fiscal agency for the 101 school districts, to enter in to a contract with the Panhandle Educational Service Organization (PESO) to provide the services. Superintendent of Spear-
man Independent School District, Dr. B.E. Reeves stated the Spearman schools would be participating in
both Title III and PESO. both Title III and PESO. Orginally the school dis-
tricts had requested $\$ 404$ rricts had requested $\$ 404$,
095 with which to operate 095 with which to operate the program for butice months ucation asked the program be trimmed. The second request, approved Friday, calls for $\$ 32,000$ less and a 10 -month program. According to Dr. Emitt
Smith, director of PESO the program's purpose is accelerate and multiply the importance of new information. The information, covering all areas, is to be by national level research
groups such as the National groups such as the National
Science Foundation's Project, English, and Project Social Studies.
Dr. Smith said the pro-
gram will differ from any project ever attempted in the country and wifl allow the secondary and elementary educators to work with re-
search material and techni-
cal instruments converting them to language that can then be ta
