

Peggy's Pointers

Have a gas water heater? Taking a vacation? Take a "hydrogen precaution" when you get home. It's especially important if you've been gone two weeks or more.

HYDROGEN PRECAUTION-Simply turn on all you hot water faucets and let the water flow from each for two minutes BEFORE using your dishwasher or clothes washer--and DO NOT SMOKE during those two

This "hydrogen precaution" is necessary to avoid a possible explosion from the hydrogen build-up that might have accumulated while you were gone.

In addition, it's wise to follow this precaution if you are moving into a residence in which the hot-water system may not have been used for two weeks or more.

In homes wi a gas water heater, the hot water system normally and regularly produces small amounts of hydrogen gas as a result of the chemical reaction of water with the corrosive-protection device inside the water heater.

This gas escapes continually-and safely--as the water faucets in the home are used.

However, when hot water is not used for an extended period of time, the highly flammable hydrogen gas can build up.

It the time period is long enough, the guilb-up of gas can to meet appointments, and to be sufficient to possibly cause run errands from 9:00 a.m. to an explosion when exposed to a noon. He will speak at 7:30 each evening with regular services on Sunday at 10:55 and 6:30. On Tuesday there will be a Pizza Supper for all Jr. and Sr. High students at 6:30 in the Morse Community Building. On Thursday at 6:30 will be a Hot Dog Supper for Grades 1-6, also at the Community Building.

Franklin has presented the Gospel to over three million people in his six-year ministry, through evangelistic crusades, church revivals, public school assemblies, college concerts, and youth rallies; thousands of these have been reached by his appearances on radio and television. More than 40,000 have professed to accept Jesus Christ into their hearts and lives as their personal Savior and Lord, and have thus begun new lives

as "born-again Christians" In his messages, the evangelist tells how he became involved in the nightmare world of drug additcion, and how he was miraculously delivered from it. His talks always deal with the stark realities of the drug and show business cultures as he personally experienced them

from 1957 to 1972. Jack Franklin was one of the fastest rising stars during the early days of rock 'n rol. music. As a vocalist and guitarist he gained national fame as he toured the nation with his band, the Rivieras, and played nightclubs and concert dates with such big names as Connie Francis, Fats Domino, Jerry Lee Lewis, Fabian, The Platters, Johnny Rivers, the Big Bopper, Brenda Lee, and Chuck Berry.

The 38 year old minister now preaches throughout the nation, combining his lifestory testimony with his talents as a singer, guitarist, Gospel Magician, and comedian, to reach young and old alike, with the good news of the Gospel of Jesus.

"The Jack Franklin Story" was broadcast around the world to 177 foreign countries in February of 1976 on the "unshackled!" radio program. This is a radio drama which enacts the true life stories of Christians who have had sensational conversion experiences. "The Jack Franklin Story" is also the title of a biographical book recently published by Pacific Garden Mission of Chicago. It is a factually true account, which proves that Jesus Christ saves souls and recycles the lives of people when they accept Him as personal Savior and Lord.

The evangelist is best known for his unique style of presenting dynamic messages from the Bible to give Christians greater victory in their lives, to lead the unsaved to Christ, and to inspire those who know Him to me to know Him better.
