This sequel to *Savannah* is filled with historical details of antebellum Savannah with romance thrown in for flavor. *Elvis and Me* by Priscilla Presley. Priscilla tells all about her romance with Elvis, marriage to him, divorce from him, etc., etc.

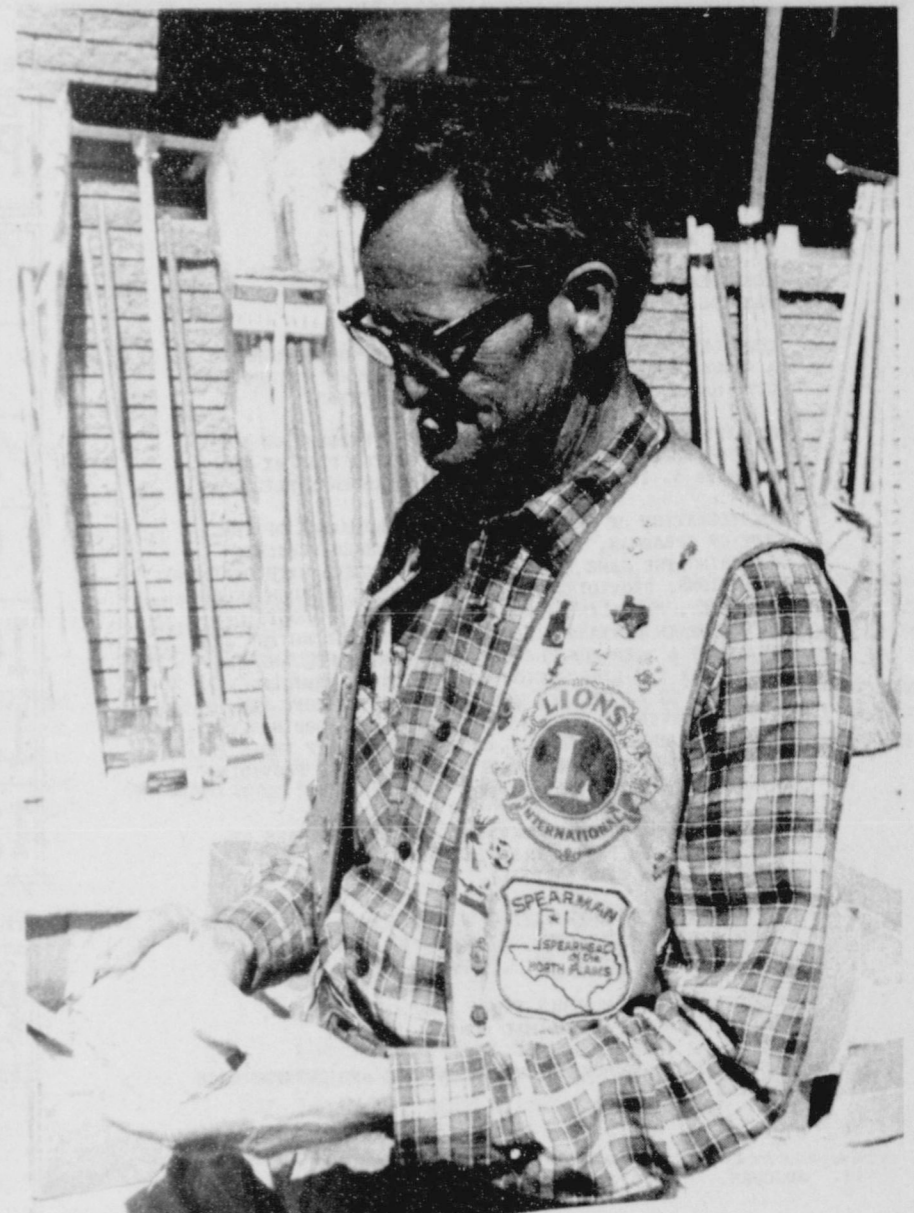

The Opportunity Plan administers 110 loan divisions, several scholarship funds, and a merit award division. Much time is spent each year showing students how to apply for all types of scholarships, grants, and other federal and state programs. Students funded through the Opportunity Plan, Inc. may attend the school of their choice, and students on the program have attended 75 different institutions of higher education.

5. How does it work?

Texas requires to two licence plates

Lubbock--Some states require only that a vehicle have a rear license plate, but Texas law requires both front and rear plates. The fine for not having both plates on your vehicle can range as high as \$200.00, according to Department of Public Safety Major V.J. Cawthon, Regional Commander of Lubbock.

The DPS considers compliance with this law important, since it enables law enforcement officers to more easily identify your vehicle if they are attempting to locate you in case of emergency. Having both plates on a vehicle also will make it easier to locate if it has been stolen, Major Cawthon said.

If a person only has one plate, a

new set of plates must be obtained from the local office of the county tax assessor-collector. The fee for a new set is \$5.30. To get the new set of plates, the old single plate must be surrendered.

Q. Can a taxpayer keep a local official from raising the taxes too high?
A. If the city or county officials are setting unreasonable rates, or if they are taxing property and services not covered by published guidelines, you may seek an injunction to halt the process. Otherwise, elected officials are empowered to set tax rates to generate sufficient income to meet the budget. Your only recourse may be to vote against that official at the next election.
