



3. What are the requirements?

Acceptance in the Opportunity Plan is based upon the character and ambition of the student and upon his financial need. Outstanding scholars are always welcome: however, the Opportunity Plan recognizes that successful businessmen and dedicated citizens are not always great scholars.

4. Facts and figures.

The Opportunity Plan, Inc. started in 1954 with a contribution of \$500.00. Since that time 6000 students have received loans amounting to \$10,000.000 of which 98% was or is being recovered to be loaned again. The Opportunity Plan administers 110 Ioan divisions, several scholarship funds, and a merit award division. Much time is spent each year showing students how to apply for all types of scholarships, grants, and other federal and state programs. Students funded through the Opportunity Plan, Inc. may attend the school of their choice, and students on the program have attended 75 different institutions of higher education

5. How does it work?

Funds are loaned to students according to budgets established at the beginning of each school term. Amounts needed by the students vary according to their individual situations. In one sense, the Opportunity Plan is like a bank. Each student has an account that reflects the amount of his budget, the amount drawn, the amount deposited, and the amount he owes.

Texas requires to two licence plates

Lubbock--Some states require only that a vehicle have a rear license plate, but Texas law requires both front and rear plates. The fine for not having both plates on your vehicle can range as high as \$200.00, according to Department of Public Safety Major V.J. Cawthon, Regional Commander of Lubbock.

The DPS considers compliance with this law important, since it enables law enforcement officers to more easily identify your vehicle if they are attempting to locate you in case of emergency. Having both plates on a vehicle also will make it easier to locate if it has been stolen, Major Cawthon said. If a person only has one plate, a new set of plates must be obtained from the local office of the county tax assessor collector. The fee for a new set is \$5.30. To get the new set of plates, the old single plate must be surrendered,

Q. Can a taxpayer keep a local official from raising the taxes too high?

A. If the city or county officials are setting unreasonable rates, or if they are taxing property and services not covered by published guidelines, you may seek an injunction to halt the process. Otherwise, elected officials are empowered to set tax rates to generate sufficient income to meet the budget. Your only recourse may be to vote against that official at the next election.
