### Firefighters Demonstrate

# 'Jaws of Life' Unit In Use If Needed

'popper" cooker turning out spaghetti with strands ending up at the strangest knife and fork you ever saw!

It was the new Hurst "Jaws of Life" unit of Spearman Volunteer Fire Department and it--and the firefighters--were the center of attraction Tuesday night at a local salvage yard where the public was treated to a demonstration of its part in saving auto crash victims.

The first simulated rescue of the evening involved a Lincoln Continental four-door sedan of early sixties vintage. Fire Chief Ronnie Antalek acted as master of ceremonies for the lay audience gathered and as quarterback for the drills.

The could-be rescue operation began with teh theory the doors on the driver side of the car were jammed by an accident and that there were victims to be removed from both front and rear seats of the vehicle.

A power unit not much larger than a firefighter's helmet was started and the exhaust note immediately identified it as a two-cycle motor. Power transmission is selective going to the "jaws" through a set of yellow flex hoses and to a scissor-like knife unit through white flex tubing.

A firefighter inserted the closed jaws in the opening edge of the car's front door, applied power and thelatch was broken and the door swung open giving access to the front passenger compartment.

The rear door was the "suicide" type opening back from the front. This cramped rescue space and the power tools were immediately applied to the task of removing the door. The hinge attacked by the mach cast iron rather than the softer metals of later models but the unit was up to the task and the door was completely removed allowing wide access for rescue someone with much pride in the partment.

Chief Antalek told the audience it was possible to execute even more drastic "surgery" on the vehicle is victim injury and position danger of fire demanded it. In short order, the steering column was bent out of over the hood, the knife unit smipped roof metal at four points, a firefighter jumped on the top of the car just over the rear window making a "crease" that allowed the roof to be laid back like opening a sardine can.

For an encore, firefighters tackled a 1957 model Buick sedan that had the top crushed in to the point where the window openings were only inches high allowing no rescue space. Here again was an older vehicle but the jaws were up to

It was noted that gasoline is present at all auto accidents and often rescue time is short in the face of possible fire or explosion. Chief Antalek pointed out that some ruptured or "squeezed" door latches could require as much as 5,000 pounds to pull open--a task impossible in a short time with an ordinary pry bar and a force of firefighters straining at it.

The jaws of life is equal to the task and places only one man operating with the rest of the force standing by to clear away parts pried off by the jaws and effect their rescues.

The Jaws-of-life unit was purchased by Baker & Taylor Drilling Co. and presented to the fire department. The company has cloaked the move in much modesty but the account making the rounds is that a super-quick emergency response to one of the company's operational sites averted a

The news release was dated JUNE 11, 1981.

There has always been a scattering of cities in the report showing a decrease in rebates received from the same period last year but they have not been retail sales or about \$20,000 many and any familiarity with per day not counting taxthem tells the story.

This report shows some 200 cities--including Gruver--to have lost ground in the first six months of this year. A similar situation with figures not so drastic occurred with the December, 1980 report which was dated some 10 or 12 days before Christmas and could not have included that season's sales . . .


