# Proposed Amendment totheState Constitution Authorizing the Levy of a Tax to Pay Jurors． 

IOINT RESOLUTION amending Bection 9 ，of Article 8．of the Constituton of the State of Texas，providing for the levying of a tax of not exceeding fifteen cents on the one hundred dollars valuation，to pay jurors．
SECTION：．Be it resolved by the Legislature of the State of Texas That Section 9，of Article 8，of the Constitution of the State of Texas， be so amended as to hereafter read as follows：

SHCTION 9．The State tax on property，exclusive of the tax neces． sary to pay the public debt，and of the taxes provided for the benefft of the public free schools，shall never exceed thirty－five cents on the one hundred dollars valuation；and no county，city or town shall levy more than twentv－five cents for city or county purposes，and not ex－ ceeding fifteen cents for road and bridges，and not exceeding fifteen cents to pay jurors，on the one hundred dollars valuation，except for the payment of debts incurred prior to the adoption of the amendment September 25 th， 1883 ，and for the erection of publie buildings，sireets， sewers，water works and other permanent improvements，not to exceed twenty－five cents on the one hundred dollars valuation，in any one year， and except as in this Constitution otherwise provided；and the Legisia ture may also authorize an additional annual ad valorem tax to be levied and collected for the further maintenance of the publie roads；provided that a majority of the qualified property tax－paying voters of the county voting at an election to be held for that purpose shall vote such tax，not to exceed fifteen cents on the one hundred dollars valuation of the prop－ erty subject to taxation in such county．And the Legislature may pass local laws for the maintenence of the public roads and highways，with－ out the local notice required for special or local laws．
$-S E C$ ．2．The Governor is hereby directed to issue the necessary proc－ lamation for submitting this amendment to the Constitution to the qualified voters of the State of Texas，on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November， 1906 ，at which election all voters favoring this amendment shall have written or printed on their ballots．＂For the amendment to authorize the levy of a tax to pay jurors．＂The voters opposed to this amendment shall have written or printed on their ballots

## Proposed Amendment to the State Constitution Fixing Salaries and Per Diem of Legislators．

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION euthorixing the suburission to n vote of the people of the stiate of Texas of a proposed aumendeuent of rection 24 ．Article 3 ，of the Constitution of the sitate of Texas，fixing the sularies and nileage of meurbers
of the Jegislature，and preventing the acoeptance，for thewsilves or for others，
 by mewbers of the Legislature of free passes，fre
vantages from certain persons aud corporations．
SECTION 1．Be it resolved by the Legistature of the State of Fexas： That at the next geveral election of the Shate of Texas，or at any pre vious election，in case an election for the State sball be had or ordered by the Covernor for other purposes，there shall te subuntted to the elec tors of the State of Texas，for their approval or disepproval，the follow ing amendment to the Constitution of the State of Trexas，as provided for in Section 1，Artiele 17 of said Constitution，relating to proposed amendments thereto，it being inteuded to amend Section 24．Article 3 of said Constitution，relating to the pay of mexubers of the Legislature， so that the said Section shatll read as follows

SEC．24．The members of the Iegislature shall reoejve trom the public treasury such compensation for their servioes as may from titue to time be provided by law，not exeseding one thousaud sothars for the year succeeding their election．payable in equal mastathenents，on the first days of January，February，March and Aprif of the yeer sucoceding their election，and Gve dollars per day for cach day of every special session heid during the second year of the term for which said tuenbers shatl be elected．In addition to said compensation the meubers of each bouse shall be entitled to mileage going to and returning from the seat of goy． ermment，which mileage shall not exceed three oents per mile，the dis tance to be computed by the nearest and most direct soute of travel by land，regartless of railways or water routes；and the Comptroller of the State shall prepare and preserve a table of distanoas to each county seat， now or hereafter to be establisined，and by said table the mileage of cach member shall be paid；but no member siball be entitled to mitheage for any extra session that may be catled wathin one clay after the ad． journment of any regular or called session．It shatl be unfawfulf for any member of the Legislature during his term of office to acoept any free transportation over avy rathway line or lines in this State，and any member of the Legislature violating the provisions of this Act probitit－ ing the acceptance of free transportation sihall forfeit the office to which be has been elected．Aud it shall be unhawful for any of such memters to accept．recieve，have，use or enjoy，directiy or inctirectly，for them－ selves or any other person，any free pass，fatik，tetbate，privikege or ad． vantage not accorded the general puthic from any ratiroad eompany， telegraph compavy，telephone eompany，sleeping car company，or other corporation，or any persons firm or corporation acting as a common carrier in this State．Any member of the Jegishature violating this provision tinall forfeit his office．And the necessary laws shall be en－ cted to earry out the provisions of this Article．

SECTION i，That Section a， of Articie VIII，of the Constitation of the State of Texas，be so amend． ed that the same shall read as fol－ lows， 19 wit

All occupation taxes shall be equal and uniform upen the same class of subjects within the limits of the authority levying the tax； but the fegislatare may，by gens eral laws，exempt from caxation public property used for publie purposes；getual places of refigigus worahip；places of burial not held for private of corperate profic；all buildings used exclusively and owned by persons of associations of persons for school purposes and the necessary fumniture of atl schools， also the endownent fands of such institutions of learning and feligion Liot used with a view to profit and when the sane ore invested in bonds or mertgages，or in land of other property whicly has been and sball hereafier be bought in by such institutions under foreclosure sales made to satisfy or protect such bonds of mortgages；that suck exemption of such land athed prop eriy shall contious only for iwo years after the purchase of the same at such sale fyy such jnstitu－
tions and nio longer，and instiut． fions of purely public charity；and dllaws exempting property from taxation other than the property above mentioned shall be null and void．
