Woman's Corner.

The opening of public school exer-

cises Bible reaping the Lords Prayer is a much agitated sugject. In various states the matter has been carried into the courts bo Romanists, Jews & agnostics. An interesting decision has been rendered recently by the court of appeals in Texas. The Supintendent of schools in Corsicana was directed by the school board to provide for such exercises at the opening & of school each morning, the exercises being identical in each room and the passages read being selected by the superintendent Patrons who were not protestants joined in a suit for injunction. The lowest court decided that the order of the school board was lawful if the individual teachers were permitted to select the passages to be read. The Court of Appeals sustained did not constitute the schools a place of worship and were not of a sectarian character. The fact that such exercises tend to teach the existence of Almighty God, was declared not to & be objectionable since the preamble & to the constitution reads, "Humbly invoking the blessings of Almighty God, the people of the State of Texas do ordain and establish this Consti- | & tution," showing conclusively the recognition of a Superior Being by the people. The Court further declared the effects of such exercises to be to teach "the glorious prin5ipals of morality that will tend to elevate humanity to a high plane and produce an exalted type of civilization, to reach which should be the aim of the people of all governments." It is re- 6 freshing to read such clear and unpredjudiced statements of the purpose of government. Our nation was founded on a faith in God, and to attempt to stifle that belief would be to allow the small minority of unbelievers to control the vast majority of those who believe in God .- Christian Observer.
