HREE generations ago New England mill owners set out to make their mills safe from fires. By sound construction, by fire extinguishing apparatus and by cleaning up rubbish they greatly cut down fire losses. Their example has not been generally followed.

OUR TENANT PROBLEMS

EDITOR'S NOTE:—This is the fourth of a series of Articles on AGRICUL-TURAL PROBLEMS prepared by Judge S. A. Lindsey, chairman of the Texas Farm Life Commission.

The tenant problem is less simple than the getting of cheap money on land worth twice the amount borrowed; all that is required in that case is to arrange the security (the best in the world) so that it is acceptable at the source of cheap money. All this is cold-blooded business between the investors in securities and those selling same. The transaction is: give me security and I will give you money. The state is not interested in this and should lake no further hand in it than to provide the law by which the ONLY TWENTY-FOUR LAST to provide the law by which the YEAR FROM EXPLODING organization for invading the cheap money market may be effected, and then giving such organization opportunity to borrow such trust funds as the government may be ending.

The problem of inducing shiftng tenants who are merely in partnership with the landlord in tobbing the soil of its fertility and lividing the swag, to induce them o buy, improve and build up the oil they till and become fixed mits of strength in their comnunities is clearly a concern of he state. This problem is close ikin if not entirely identical both n purpose and result to that of general education. The strength and vigor of the state is as much lependent upon conserving the ertility of the soil as upon the ntelligence of the people. amily is the unit of the state ind the home surroundings, the prosperity, the optimism and eduation of the members of the family pell the strength and vigor of the state. If the state would be trong and enduring it must eduate its citizens and attach them sense of weakness and insecurity empels them to seize at straws as to the drowning.

Mr. V. T. Hoggatt, Register State Land Board of Colorado told me the other day how his state is attempting to convert tenants i to land-owners. He said Colorado has \$6,000,000 of permanent chool funds. This money is beng made available in this way: The counties are given the privilege of investing their proportionate part in the notes of purchasers of homes. This is done through the commissioner's courts. The court considers each individual case. If the man is honest, intelligent, industrious and capable of paying out the land and the land is worth the money, the court buys the land for him, or takes up his notes and gives him 40 years at 5 per cent interest in which to pay. The county must see that the state does not lose its funds. Every proposed loan is advertised and the people knowing the county to be responsible to the state assist in preventing an unworthy or unsafe case from getting through.

Inasmuch as the people of a state have adopted this plan let us consider it closely, before dismissing or advocating it. For remember we are not writing a political platform but studying a modern! question in economies or statecraft which is now upon us for solution.





Vocational Education Adapted to People's Needs
