# Piggly Wiggly Will Hold Grand Opening Tomorrow

W. T. Kidwell is holding a grand opening this Friday and Saturday for his Piggly Wiggly No. 1 store in its new modern building at Avenue L and Lockwood Street (Brownfield Highway), two blocks west of his old location.

The new building contains 7,200 square feet of floor space, about the same size as the former location, but occupies a lot 200 by 250 feet in size. All the lot, except that space occupied by the building, is paved and there are spaces for 78 cars to be parked.

Construction of brick, tile, steel, and concrete, the building features every modern device for the display and service of foods. It has central heating, refrigerated air conditioning, automatic in-and-out doors, and new display cases for meats, frozen foods, vegetables, and dairy products.

The store will be closed Thursday to get ready for the opening, during which low prices are featured in every department. There will be free door prizes, free drinks for all, and balloons and candy for the kiddies.

Since buying power has become a key to success in the food store business, Mr. Kidwell says buying in large quantities through Affiliated Food Stores warehouse of Amarillo is a big help. He is a director of this organization.

In fact, he has been on the board of South Plains Associated Grocers for 17 years, which built a large warehouse in Lubbock in 1962, but this group has now combined with Panhandle Associated Grocers and this year will have sales totaling 60 to 70 million dollars. Kidwell is a director of this new combine, which he says gives its members the best buying power possible.

Kidwell met his wife here in Tahoka, the former Miss Esta Mae Rogers, to whom he was married in 1939. They have two children, Mrs. Chas. (Karen) McAden, Jr. of Austin and Tommy Kidwell and two grandchildren.

Horace Rogers, the No. 1 store manager who has been with the firm for 18 years, is married to the former Miss Jewel Fay Elmore and they have a married son, Jimmy, who is in the Armed Forces.

Turner Rogers, partner in the No. 2 store, has been with the firm a total of 14 years. His wife is the former Miss Euella Dollins, and they have three children, David, Dale, and Dean.

O. L. Kidwell, father of W. T., was associated with the business until retiring in 1960. Kidwell, over the years has been active in town and county civic work. He served as member of Tahoka Fire Department for 20 years, on the

school board three years, on the City Council six years, and as a Chamber of Commerce director for six years. At the present time, he is a member of the Lynn County Hospital Board.

Since its inception, he has been a sponsor of Little League ball teams in the local league. He has also been president of the Bulldog Booster Club, and has worked with many other civic projects.

# Bale Count Above Estimate

County ginners have pulled all stops this month, ginning a total bale count of 143,911 bales to December 17. This far exceeds the total for the same period last year, of just around 70,000 bales.

A greater percent of the cotton ginned, in this report is Lynn County produced, and points out that the total production will exceed the projected county estimate of 130,000 bales.

Some of the gins report that at the time of the total count they had at least 700,000 bales standing in the yards, awaiting ginning.

Reports from the Plains Cotton Growers state that there is a significant improvement in staple length and fiber strength of this year's High Plains crop. According to Donald Johnson, Executive Vice-president of the Plains Cotton Growers, Inc., "despite the fact that prices for our better cottons

this season have been disappointing, the proven ability to grow the longer and stronger varieties as well as the shorter staples is still a definite plus factor in the long range outlook for cotton in this area."
