## the State of Texas: <br> Section 1. That Section 18 Arture of Steras 5, of the Constitution of the State of Texas, be amended so as to hereafter read as follows:

 Each organized now or hereafter existing, shall be di vided from time to time, for the convenlence of the people, into fustice pro efncts, not less than four and not mor than twelve. The present county
courts shall make the first divisin Subsequent divisions the fhall be made by by this Constitution. precinct there shall be in each such biennial election, one justice of the peace and one constable, each of whon until his successor shall be elect ed and qualified; provided, that
any prectnct in which there may nny prectnct in which there may be
ctty of eight thousand or Itants, there shall be elected two jus.
tices of the peace. Each county shal in like manner and in the first instance be divided into four commissioners
prectncts, in each of which there shal precincts, in each of which there shal
be gleoted by the quallfied voters thereof one county commissioner, who shall
hold his offlce for two years and until his successor shall be elected and quall fled. Subsequent divisions of a county Into commissloners' precincts shall b made as is now or hereafter may be
