Plainview's \$60,000

Ralway Depot

here, beginning Friday night The Santa Fe is now building before the second Sunday in a depot in Plainview, which, June. when completed, will be one of the most elegant and commodious structures of similar kind vices for the meeting. in Northwest Texas.

The contractor is responsible for the statement that the cost of the building will be \$60,000. side from the freight bills on materials, this being laid down here by the railway company without charge to the contractor.

The building is located just west of the present depot, and will be at the head of Pacific street, the railroad authorities having taken proper steps to secure the site against opening the street continuing, north, thus interfering with their plans.

Orders have been issued to enlarge the yard facilities at this place and also to add another passenger track through the entire yards.

A seperate building is to be built for a baggage room, and it will be constructed entirely of concrete.

The Herald does not surmise in making the statement that by October 1st this city will be one of the important stations on the Santa Fe's main line to the Gulf

It is stated that the company expects to have trains running over the Texico-Coleman cut-off by September 15. All of these trains will stop in Plainview.

Railroad officials, especially those who have anything to do with building new lines or improvements, are almost a negaproposition when it comes to giving out prior information concerning any contemplated work, and it is not authoritatively stated by any of them that the line from Canyon to Lubbock is to be used as the main line of the cut-off, yet their many moves in this city and refusal to answer positively, either in the affirmative or negative, is almost equal to the assurance that such is the fact.

There appears to be no hurry to build the line from Lubbock to Texico, and they are rushing the work on the additional passenger tracks and yard facilities here.

Their coaling station here is far ahead of any other on the line, and of much greater bapacity than ever would be needed at any but a point where numbers of engines must be supplied.

The water supply at this place has been the subject of much correspondence, inspection and official tests, both as to volume and fitness for boiler purposes, and it has been found entirely

satisfactory in every respect. For some time past it has been definately known that the railroad company was considering the question of a new depot at this place, and when the preliminary work was started and the information given out that the new building would cost, in material and actual work, the sum of sixty thousand dollars it was regarded as possibly a padded estimate, and when a Herald representative expressed incredu- he has simply changed his occupation,

Increasing Production.

The increase in agricultural produc tion has both an individual and community interest. The farmer is vitally interested in increasing the yield, as it costs no more to cultivate an acre of land that produces two bales of cotton than it does an acre of land that produces one bale of cotton, and the second bale is clear profit to the farmer. The farmers who have followed the advice of our agricul tural departments in selecting seed methods of culture, character of crops combating pests, etc., have been able to double production. The farms of Texas are vielding an average of \$1,540,000 per day, and by doubling production in that portion of the land now under cultivation we can produce \$1,122,678,000 instead of \$361,339,000 per annum as shown in the figure be-



Increase in Production.

A concrete example would perhaps be more satisfactory than an imaginary standard, says the Texas Com mercial Secretaries' Association, and we will, therefore, compare Texas with Illinois. Our lands are more fer tile, our seasons more reliable and our climatic conditions more favor able to farming than in Illinois Ir Illinois the average farm contains 124 acres and yields \$1,309 per farm!
