Dr. Huffier, a prominent surgeon
of Paris, reports two cases of suc-
essful grafting of bone on a human elbow, in a communication to the
Academy of Medicine. The two operations were performed more
than a year ago, and as the subjects are in perfect health there can no
longer be any doubt of the success of the experiment. The surgeon
says that he was called upon to treat the arm of a young man of twenty-
