FARM BUREAU PLANS GIGANTIC EXPANSION

MUCH PROGRESS IS SEEN-CARL WILLIAMS, PRESIDENT IS ALL SMILES.

DALLAS HEADQUARTERS CITY

General Committee and Several Sub-Committees Are Chosen to Consider the Business.

Dallas-An inspiring word picture of an organization that shall be second in size in the United States only to the United States Steel Corporation as regards volume of business handled and that shall bring the cotton farmer out of serfdom into a profitable partnership in the greatest business enterprise of the times was drawn before the Texas Farm Bureau Federation Thursday afternon by Carl Williams of Oklahoma, president of the American Cotton Growers' Exchange and commodity cotton marketing blaze-trailer. The Oklahoma Cotton Association, which came into being through the Oklahoma farm paper editor's activities already is the biggest single business institution in that State, Mr. Williams told members of the Texas Federation. He said that if the affairs of the exchange assume larger proportions he will move to Dallas, the headquarters city.

For the first 28,000 bales of cotton handled the association got for its members an average of \$7.65 a bale more for their cotton than the prevailing market price and effected a saving of \$7.20 in grade. In conferences attended by more than 5000 members, Mr. Williams said, five men had voted against the association policies while all of the rest had given indorsement to all of its works.

Treasures in Waste-Paper Baskets. | FOUGHT LONG OVER SILESIA

Frederick the Great and Maria The resa Sworn Foes on Account of "Debatable Land."

How many "travelers in little things" know that Upper Silesia, now so often in the world's mouth, was once the cause of a change of name in certain country inns far away in England? And Eighteenth-century England was very far from Silesia in point of time. During the continental wars of that century the British sometimes hired Frederick the Great of Prussia for their ally and sometimes the Empress Maria Theresa, better known to the public then as the queen of Hungary; and many a country inn was called by their names. But the more prudent inn-keeper kept two signs. When Frederick was likely to be popular with his guests, he hung out "The King of Prussia"; but as soon as policy changed, and the popular opinion of travelers with it, up went the head of "The Queen of Hungary." So you might ride down over the brow of the hill into the village, and "The King of Prussia" would welcome you in three-cornered hat and peruke. But next time, instead of his narrow jaw, you would eatch sight of the overhanging lip of the Hapsburg. and would dismount under the fullbottomed wig of the empress. To this hour one sits his horse so at the bottom of Unter den Linden in Berlin and the other her throne off the Burg Ring in Vienna. Now, he and she were sworn foes; they were in honor bound to take opposite sides, and the standing ground of their quarrel was the possession of this debatable land, Silesia.

Overlapping Watersheds.


