S. F. Singleton Recalls Rraid of Almost Forty Years Ago

BACK IN INDIAN DAYS

Speaking of the country around Tahok, Texas, now, as compared with 40 years ago, reminds S. F. Singleton of that place that he

had been there a good while. When he located in that country it was 150 miles to the railroad, and the Indians were pretty numerous.

"I it was in 1873," said Mr. ingleto, "that General McKenzie made a killing among the red skins there, and cleaned them up in such a way that they never came back again. As l recall it he drove them clear out bout 600 horses.

"Today we have a country under fence and have railroads, and farms, instead of corrals range with no settlers. For a good many years we had to drive our cattle 150 miles to a shipping point. Then we had a road nearer, perhaps half that distance away, and still nore recently we have had a road built close so that we have every convenience now in handling stock."-Kansas City Drovers Telegram.


