PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE STATE CONSTITUTION, PROVIDING FOR AND RELATING TO THE CREATION OF CONSERVATION DISTRICTS
enate Joint Resolution No 12.
Proposing to amend Article 16 of the Constitution of the State of Texas by dding thereto at the end thereof another section to be known as Section teclaring the conservation and preservation of ail the natural resources
he State of Texas are public rights and duties; providing for the creation of conservation districts, declaring such districts bodies politic and corporate defining the authority of such disticts, and conferring upon the Legislature auave authority generally to legislate for the purpose of conserving the natura resources of the State, fixing the time for the election for the adoption or jection of said proposed constitutional anvednment; making certain provisions
for said election and the ballots thereof and the methods thereof; directing the suance of the and the ballots thereof and ter methods tuties of the Gover of the State and making an appropriation to defray the expense of said ele
$\qquad$
Iesole By the Legislature of the State of Texas:
Section 1-That Article 16 of the Constitution of the State of Texas be amenc , and which shall read as follows
Section 59a-The conservation and development of all of the natural resour s of this state, including the control, storing, preservation and distribution of its storm and flood waters, the waters of its rivers and streams, for irrigation, emi-arid and other lands needing irrigation, the reclamation and drainage its over-flowed lands, and other lands needing drainage, the conservation an its inland and coastol atural resources of the state are each and all hereby declared public rights and dutie
(b) There may be created within the State of Texas, or the state may bc etermined to be essential to the accomplishment of the purposes of this amend ment to the constitution, which districts shall be governmental agencies an uihority to exercise such rights, privileges and functions concerning the ect matter of this amendment as may be conferred by law.
(c) The Legislature shall authorize all such indebtedness as may be necei aryievement for the purpose of this amendment, and all such indebtedness be evidenced by bonds of such conservation and reclamation districts, to be ssned under such regulations as may be prescribed by law and shall also, authorributed, as may be necessary for the payment of the interest and the creation of a sinking fund for the payment of such bonds; and also for the maintenance f. such districts and improvements, and such indebtedness shall be a lien upon he property assessed for the payment thereof; provided the Legislature shal not authorize the issuance of any bonds or provide for any indebtedness against qualified property taxpaying voters of such district and the proposition adopted Section ?-The foregoing canatitutiona! amendment shall be submitted to vote of the qualified electors for members of the Legislature at an election beld for such purpose on the Third Tuesday in August, A. D. 1917, the sam being the 21 st day of August, A. D. 1917. At said election the vote shall be by
offlcial ballot which shsll have written or printed thereon the words "For the amendment to Article 16 of the Constitution of the State of Texas providing fo conservation districts, the creation of such districts and their government a Constitution of the State of Texas providing for conservation districts, the reation of such districts and their government and regulation.

## Producers Must Raise About Twice Usual Production To

 Feed Nations Allies And Self\& M. COLLEGE PRESENTS PLAN

The situaaion that faces the United States today is the most critical the nation has ever been alled upon to solve. With 123, 000,000 people who owe allegiance to the United States Flag to feed and cloth, we have added one third of the population of
he world who look to us to furthe world who look to us to fur-
nish them them with a large pornish them them with a large por ion of their food.
The only solution of this situation is for the producers to raise
about twice the per capita conabout twice the per capita con-
sumption of the nation. To meet sumption of the nation.
this required production, it is necessary that that the producers know what that per capita consumption is, and considering the lateness of the only feasiable method is by county organization. The A. \&. M. College presents the following plan: The county commissiners pro ceed at once to make a carefu survey or investigation and as certain;
(1) From local merchants the volume of each staple food pro dnct normally required to feed the county for one year.
(2) From farmers, by the poll tax rolls, the supply of each pro ducts on the basis of present plantings ahd herds of live stock When the deficiency between consumption and production is found, urge farmers to plan sufficient extra acreage to make this deficiency up on a basis of normal yeilds.
It is suggested that the commissioners appoint a commission above information and pay them for a reasonable amount of time to compile the neccessary datta. As the harvest season ap proaches the College suggests the establishment of municipal village and community plants for drying and canning food products. The farms and gardens Lynn County should be able froduce enough foud products reed the entire county and a sur us for shipment. fill sachate this work the Ne will secure and publish receipts for canning and preserving all
staple food products that can be staple food products that can be
grown in this section of $t h e$ state.
The important thing is for the county to organize to conserve the food supply.
