Cotton Boll Worm

Wilmona Newell, State Entomologist of Texas at the A. & M. College, has made the following answer to an enquirer regarding cotton pests, which is rather important:

"The boll worm passes the winter in the chrysalis or cocoon stage, in small cells a couple of inches below the surface of the ground. If you will plow your fields during the winter (now) and then run over them with a drag, you will break up many of these underground cells and expose the insects to the weather and to the attacks of birds, thus hitting the pest a blow before your crop is in."

"The corn ear-worm of corn and the boll worm are one and the same insect. There are several broods, or 'crops' of them during the summer, the first two or three broods of worms feeding on corn and the third and fourth broods on cotton. Corn is the favorite food plant of the insect and the moth, or miller, will not lay many of its eggs anywhere else when it can find corn in the silk. You can therefore protect your cotton crop to a considerable extent by the following method: Plant field corn, a few rows about every 100 yards, in your cotton field at a late date, so that it will come into silk during the first week in August, not before. The third brood of millers appears the first week in August, ordinarily, and if they find the corn in silk they will lay

Cotton Boll Worm

Continued from first page. eggs on the corn silks in preference to laying them on cotton. After the eggs are laid on the corn silks and they hatch into worms, the worms in each ear fight among themselves until all but one or two of them are killed. Thus you compel the worms to destroy themselves.

"You can further protect the cotton crop, at any time the boll worms are doing damage by dusting the cotton with powdered arsenate of lead (don't use Paris green) at the rate of from 3 to 8 pounds per acre, depending upon the size of the plants. This is most successful, however, if applied while the worms are still small, as they bore into the bolls where the poison won't reach them. In fighting the boll worm it is not necessary to apply the powdered arsenate of lead with a dust gun, as the bulletin recommends when fighting the boll weevil. For the boll worm you can dust the powdered arsenate on from a sack, as you do in dusting Paris green onto the cotton for the cotton worm.

"It would not pay to try to capture the millers with lights. You would get some of them, but you would get mainly the males and females that have finished laying eggs—destroying either one would do no good, as you can readily see. Your lights would also destroy more beneficial insects than injurious ones. The measures I have mentioned above are still more effective than using the trap lights.
