Dr. S. H. WINDHAM Railroad Charter Filed. Roscoe, Snyder and pacific Has \$200,000 Capitol.

Austin, Tex., Oct., 1 .- The Attourney General approved and the Secretary of State filed the charter of the Roscoe, Snyder & Pacific Railway Company, with principal office at Roscoe, Nolan County, Capital Stock \$200,000. Purpose construction of a line of railroad from Roscoe, on the Texas and Pacific, northwest through the counties of Nolan, Fisher, Scurry, Porden, Lynn, Lubbock, Hockley, TEXAS Cochran and Bailey on the New Mexico line, a distance of 200 miles. Incorporators: E. W. James, J. E. Wills, Eugene Wood, Lawyer, Notary, Land Agent W. G. Swenson, Ed Hughes, Henry James and J. M Wagstaff, all of Abileue, Tex., and N. T. Reed and A. A. Reed, both of Hutchinson. Kansas. - Dallas News.

STEEL SECURED.


