TAHOKA NOW A COTTON MARKET TOWN
As predicted in last week's News, our new gin started running the first part of thin week. Bright and early Tuesday morning, the power was turned on at the new plant and soon the first bale of Lynn county cotton ever ginned in Tahoka was lying on the yard waiting for a buyer.
This cotton was all raised by Mr. C. C. McLaurin on his tarm near Central in the southwest part of the county and fifteen miles from own. Quite a handsome preminm -about \$30 was raised for him.
The new gin has been running pretty steadily this week and over ifty bales have been turned out. Very little difficulty iwas expericaced in starting or running the machinery, since the men in charge ar: experienced ginners and know their business. We are glad to snow that this new enterprise has maces the a fine start.
