# **Tahoka** To The Front.

### New Gin-New Store-New Woodman Hall.

This issue of the News marks the dawning of a new gra in the history of Tahoka and Lynn county for before this paper reaches half of its readers, Lynn county will have passed from the all cattle class of counties to the stock farming class. If nothing unforeseen interferes, the new gin will be tearing loose the cotton in the next day


This new plant, put in by Messers Wells and Welcher at a cost of nearly \$5000, is the biggest thing in th machinery line ever brought to l'alloka. The system tised is the Munger Continental and consists of two 70 saw stands and a duplex press and is equipped with pneumatic conveyors and intimetous other convenience. The outfit, which has a capacity of three bales per hour, is driven by a 40 horsepower Faitbanks Morse single cycle gasoime engine, cooled by water and ignited by an electric dynamo and storage battery. To give some idea of the magnitude of this new enterprise, we would mention that the two fly wheels of the engine are six feet in diameter and bung on a REATAL DISEASES A SPECIALTY shaft over four inches in diameter Shaft and wheels together weigh over 5000 lbs-a big four horse load.
