We hear some complaint of damage done to the school house during the Woodman supper last Saturday eve. It is nice to be able to use the school house for gatherings in a community but the general public should bear in mind that the first object of school property is to facilitate the education of children. This object cannot be properly fulfilledif some thoughtless person is going to damage the seats, put the bell out of action and otherwise inconvenience both teachers, pupils and patrons.

## A Prince Of Prevaricators.

Aiter the battle of Santiago, th immortal Schley said: "There i ghary erough for us all." but he was mistaken, for a jealous rival som midertook to appropriate alt the glory for himself.
Noiv, the homeseckers are pourug into all parts of Texas by the Hou-ands, but the fact that most of them are coming to the westert part of the State, where fertile land can still be had cheap, has excited the jeatousy of the editors and tank agents back in the thickly settled counties where farming land is any where from $\$ 25$ to $\$ 100$ per acte; and in order to keep people from co ming here, they have resorted to ait kinds of rank falsehoods about the plains country. These slanders should not go unchailenged any longer.
A correspondent in the Farmers' Forum of the Dallas News, complains that the letters from this see tion are too highty colored. He claims to have explored Lymu and adjacent counties and talked with a number of farmers, all ot whon wanted to seli out preity bad, but these same tarmers, he says, told inim that the blue weeds
taking the country and ruming the farms. Pretty origit men to run down the thing they were trying to sell.!
Evidently, the writer was cirunk half the time or else travelled altogether at night, for he did not see a single newly improved place on the entire trip. Had he travelied along the main roads in day time as any honest white man should have done, he could not have passed from Gail to Tahoka and thence to Lubbock without seeing dozens of newly improved places. He would have found that instead of farmers ail wanting to sell out, our real estate menc can't get hold of enough improved farms to supply the demand for them.

The man who wrote that letter must have been an emmissary of the land and town booming corporations back east, it seems incredible that any fairminded person would perpetrate such an assortment of falsehoods on a long suffering public. Among the many advantages of Lynn county over the east, we might mention: cheap land producing fine crops, plenty of moisture without flonds and tornadoes, fine climate, good water, good health and good society; no negroes, paupers, criminals, chills, splenetic fever, crab grass. rag weeds, cockle burs. Any of the above-named vegetables are harder tc get rid of than the blue weeds.
