HALE CENTER MAN STILL SEARCHING FOR SWINDLERS

"I will never be satisfied until the gates of a penitentiary clang behind another member of that gang and I will never quit my efforts to obtain that result as long as a spark of life remains in my body."

Thus spoke J. Frank Norfleet, Hale Center ranchman, who has tracked four members of an alleged swindling ring to the four corners of the United States; sprung a trap in Denver on the largest gang of swindlers ever recorded in the history of that city and is now searching for another member of the band which defrauded him of \$45,000. Norfleet was in Fort Worth Friday and will remain here for a few days visiting his close friend, Sterling P. Clark. He arrived here Thursday night from Dallas and will return in a few days to his ranch at Hale Center.

Norfleet has been visiting his father and mother in Cooke county, he said, and after a short stop at his ranch, he will resume his search for the fifth member of the Joe Furey gang.

"My motives are not strictly selfish revenge, but I believe in upholding the law and enforcing the creed of the West," he exclaimed, in regard to his intensive campaign against the swindlers on his own expense.

"When those men broke bread with me they were planning to fleece me of my hard-earned savings and when they accepted the hospitality of my home, they were making ready to pay the penalty.

"I have got the ring leaders, Joe Furey was the brains of the organization, and he is dead—died in prison.

"There is only one more that I really want. The other one does not amount to much, but I have started after him and I intend to get what I go after," he concluded.

Several months ago Norfleet figured in one of the most sensational captures of fleecers in the history of Denver. Aided by the District attorney's force and the Oklahoma state rangers, the Texas ranchman figured in the arrest of thirty-nine men. Guarded for three days in confinement by men who thought they had a sucker, Norfleet explained how, under the plea that he was suffering with a toothache, he prevailed upon his captors to take him to a dentist, to whom he confided his secret and had the district attorney's office notified of his predicament which resulted in the raid.—Fort Worth Record.

Authorities here held the death to have been suicide, after finding an empty bottle in the water of the canyon, labeled "poison."
