A Herd of Buffalo at the Grand Canyon.

Col. C. J. Jones, the noted frontiersman, perhaps better known as "Buffalo" Jones, has bought a carload of/buffalo bulls in New Hampshire and will ship them to his big ranch, on the Kaibab plateau just across from El Tovar hotel Grand Canyon of Arizona.

Mr. Jones has been experimenting with a new animal which he calls catalo, a cross between the buffalo and the ordinary cow. is claimed that the catalo is hardy, has a fine hide and produces excellent meat.

The herd of catalo at the Grand Canyon will be a great attraction for vistors.
