





Fine dresses, sumptuous feasts, fine houses etc., led to gross immoralities. They did not want a Savior who would save them from their sins-they wanted to continue in them. Herod demanded of the priests and scriber information as to where Christ should be born. They soon were able to tell him. These people had a technical knowledge of the Scriptures, but had no heart for the Savior set forth therein. They had no disposition to seek Him. This all occurred in Jeru salem, the city of the King-the place of all places where He should have been welcomed. It seems where the greatest privileges are, there is the greatest indifference shown as to spiritual matters. III, The King Found (vv. 9-12).

The Wise Men having obtained the desired information, started immediately to find the King. As soon as they left the city, the star which had guided them from the East appeared again to lead them on.
