1969 tax collections for November were \$11,478.73 after 2 percent discount was allowed.  
Collections for November 1968 were \$15,942.06. On November 30th approximately 65 percent of the current taxes had been paid in comparison to 68 percent at this time last year. One percent discount will be allowed on taxes paid in December.  
Only 145 registered to vote for the month of November, making a total of 999 qualifying to vote in the elections for 1970. ## Cantata To Be Held This Sunday Night

"The Night the Angels Sang" by John W. Peterson will be presented Sunday night, December 14, at 7:00 p.m. in the Sanctuary of the United Methodist Church. The Cantata chorus is made up of members of the choirs of the First Baptist and the United Methodist Churches and is under the direction of Mrs. Harold Green, Director of Music of the United Methodist Church. Mrs. Clay Bennett, Organist of the First Baptist Church, will be the Cantata organist and Miss Donna Edwards, High School Senior, will be the pianist. The Nar-

rator, reading Biblical passages from both Matthew and Luke, will be Rev. Hugh B. Daniel, Pastor of the United Methodist Church.  
Tenor Soloist will be Marlin Hawthorne, singing "He Shall Be Great." The alto solo, "Wonderful Name of Jesus," will be done by Mrs. Clayton Carter. Jerry Ford, Jr. will sing the bass solo, "Fear not; For Behold, I Bring You Good Tidings."

In addition to the cantata the choir will also sing a condensed arrangement of the "Hallelujah Chorus" from The Messiah by Handel. Handel's oratorio was composed in twenty-four days, between August 22 and September 14, 1741. The text is taken entirely from the scriptures. When it was performed in London on March 23, 1743, King George II was present, and as the "Hallelujah Chorus" pealed forth, he and all the audience, moved by the thrilling music, rose to their feet and remained standing until the chorus ended. For more than two centuries, this practice has continued.

When Handel had finished composing "Hallelujah," a servant found him at his desk with tears streaming down his face. "I think I did see all Heaven before me, the great God himself," Handel said. The work is credited with having had more performances than any masterpiece in the history of music. Following the performance, the audience is invited to Fellowship Hall for refreshments served by the members of the Wesleyan Service Guild.

Moore was born May 18, 1923 in Loraine. He had lived in Tahoka nearly all of his life. He was engaged in farming activities, and a member of the Tahoka Church of Christ.

Moore died Dec. 2, in a Lubbock hospital as the result of respiratory failure.

He was the nephew of Mrs. Cleo Marlin of Lubbock and Mrs. Hattie Bartley of Odessa, both formerly of Tahoka.

Other survivors include his step father, O. B. Durham of Spur; 2 sister, Wilmas Moore of Midland and Mrs. Cleo Williams of Amarillo; 2 step-brothers, Johnny Durham of Verona, Missouri, and Raymond Durham of Olton.

Benny Barton, 17, Rt. 2, O'Donnell, Texas, has been selected one of six national scholarship winners in the National 4-H Swine program.

Announcement of the \$600 scholarship awards was made at a recognition breakfast in Chicago during the 48th National 4-H Congress, Moorman Mfg. Co., Quincy, Ill., presented the scholarships to the youths selected by the Cooperative Extension Service.

A high school junior, Barton is one of three children of Mrs. Frankie Barton. The family lives on a farm and the swine project was started on a gift of a gilt and a barrow in a pig chain program. Earlier, Barton raised and sold eight feeders to raise money to finance his 4-H work.

The Lynn County youth reports that he has fed 519 hogs for market during his seven years in the program. He also has shown 42 barrows and gilts and worked with several demonstration boars.

Barton says that he has carried show animals in his program as well as market hogs, feeder

sales stock and new breeders.

"Shows are an important part of my 4-H work," he says. "I like having my hogs judged because this is one of the best ways to keep up to date. The judge always tells what is good and what is not quite right about your pig. This helps me a great deal."

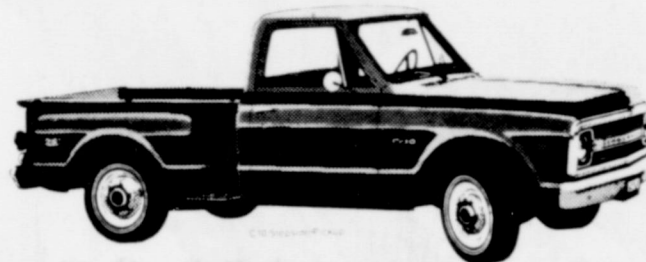
Barton has put a part of his profits into a college savings fund. He wants to make a career in animal husbandry and he feels he already has made a good start toward his goal.

"From my club work, I am learning things that will help me all my life," he says. "I have learned responsibility and how to manage money better."

Barton has also been active in other 4-H projects. He exhibited his cotton and grain for several years at the county fair.

He participated in a county workshop as part of his 4-H electric program and has completed projects in entomology, health, photography and town as a junior leader for over four years and has occupied himself in citizenship and judging programs.

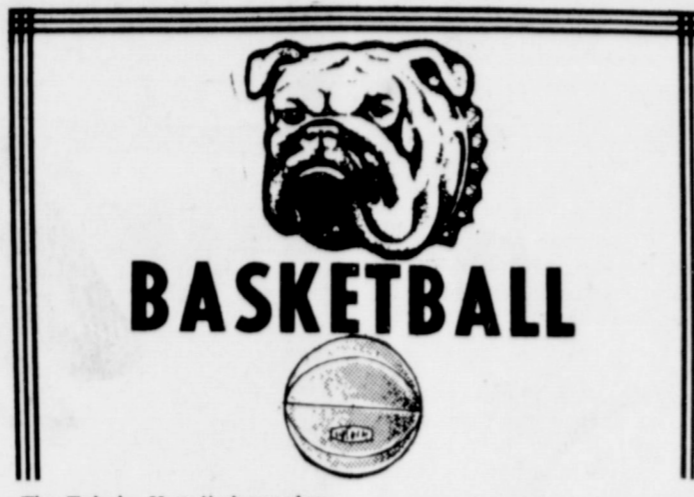

Dr. Raymond T. Bynum, director of the McMurry Band since 1946, is one of the best

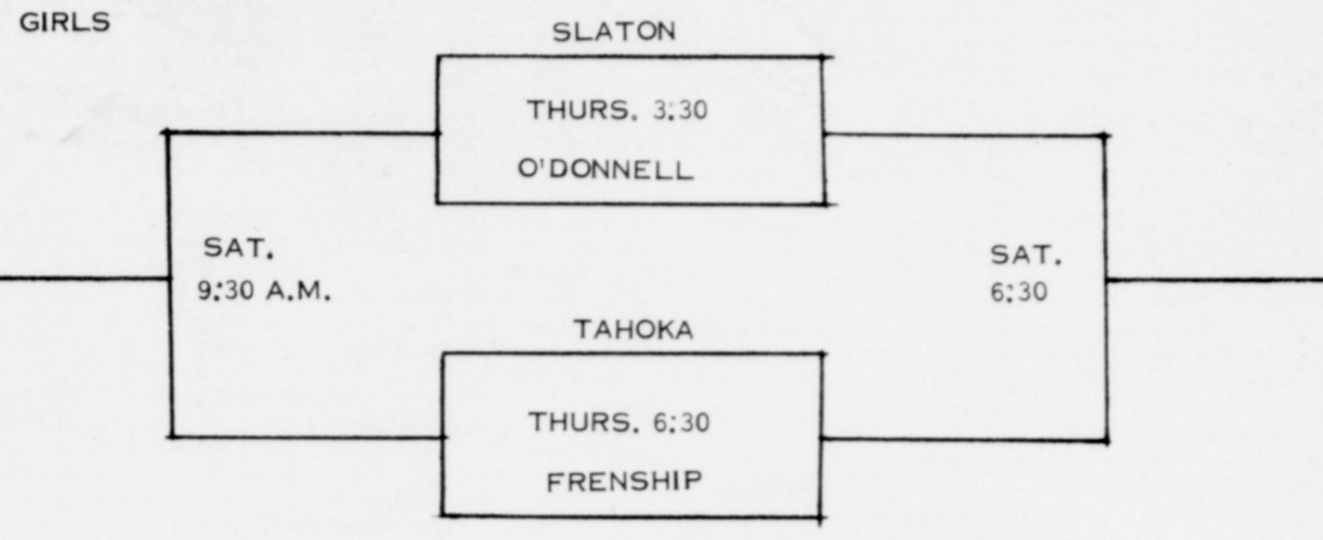
known bandmasters in the Southwestern United States. He is one of five Texans to hold membership in the American Bandmasters Association.

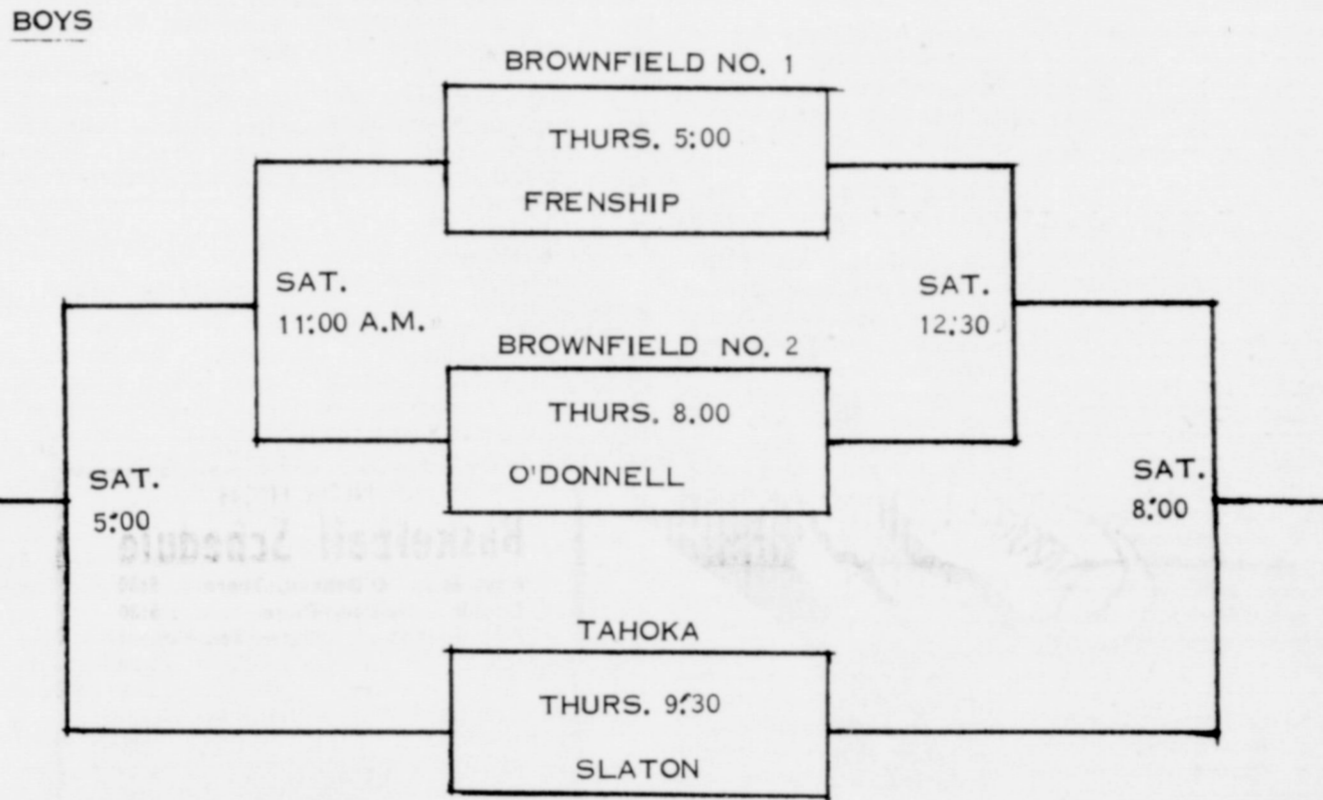

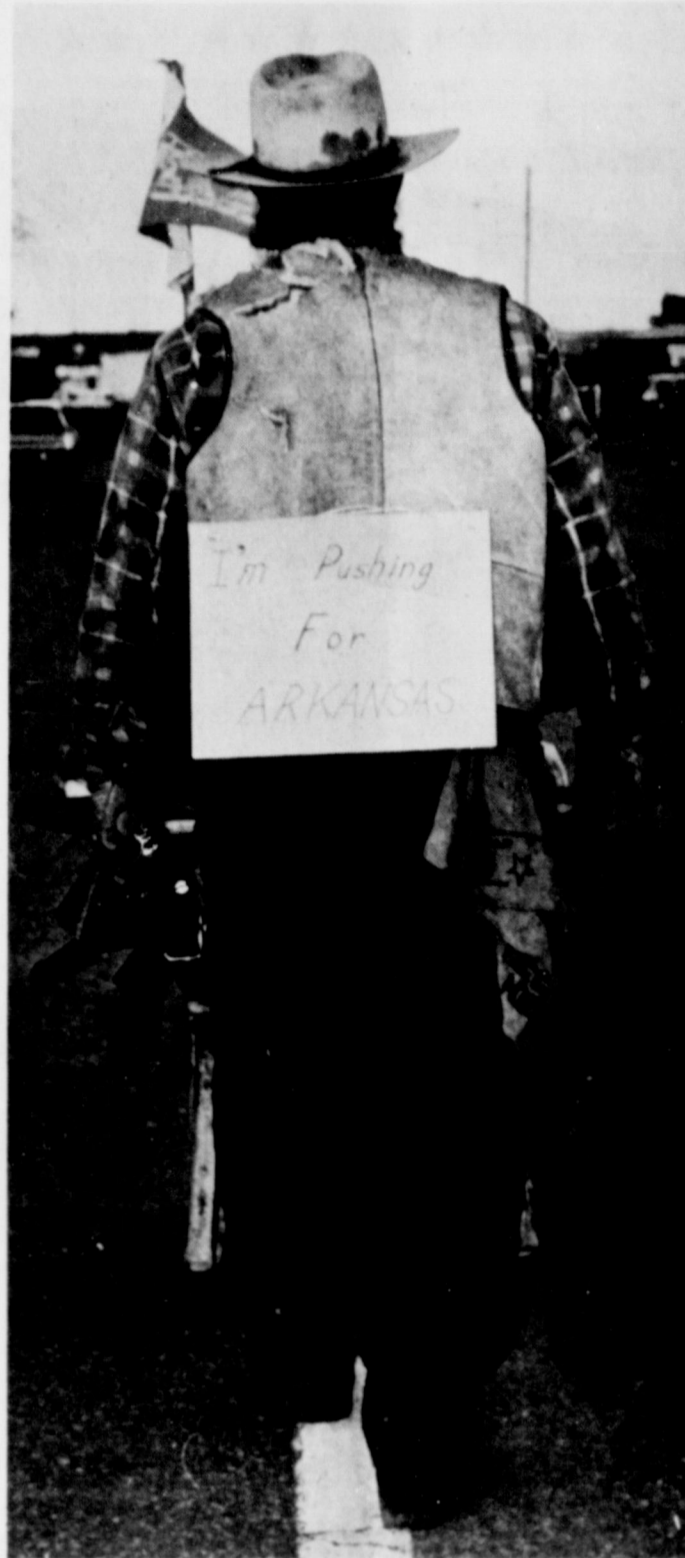

**Bill Griffin, County Agent, Says....**

**NARROW ROW COTTON:**  
The narrow row cotton demonstration located on the Jerald Barton farm 3 miles North 1/2 miles West of O'Donnell was harvested on November 7, 1969. The harvest was set up as a meeting to show the cotton stripper with a finger header actually harvesting cotton. The stripper was also equipped with a burr extractor. The Lynn County demonstration planted in 20 inch rows. The equipment was furnished by the South Plains Research Center through the courtesy of Elmer Hudspeth. Mr. Hudspeth and his own crew harvested the demonstration and the cotton was hauled to the South Plains Research gin and was ginned by Mr. Roy Baker in charge of the research at the U.S.D.A. ginning laboratory. The cotton produced 250 lbs. of lint per acre. The lint per cent was 30 per cent on Lockett 4789A and 27 per cent on C.A. 491. The grade was strict low middling, staple 31-32 and micronaire 3.7.

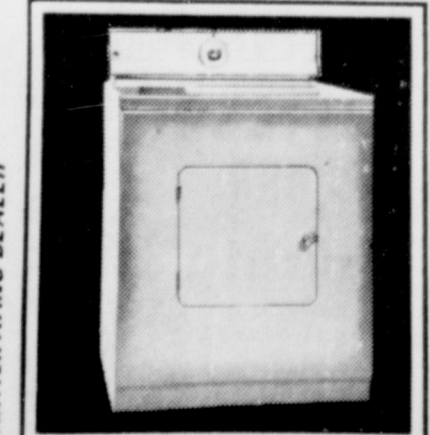

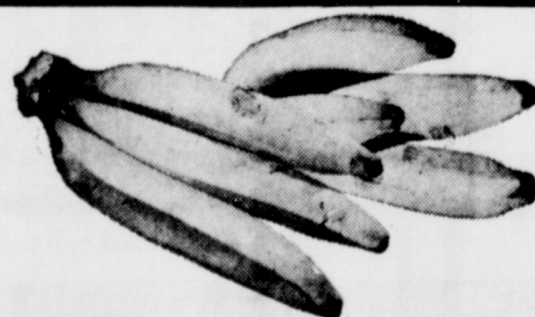
