Marga: Jones, president of the Wichita Valle; Railway Co. will be aere :it a fes days with his cheif eugine for the purpose of prosprecting a :ailroac. west from Haskell over which to build a branch of bis road into the plains country, atier the compietion of the extension nowin progress t. Standford via this place.
Col. Jones has already prospected
a line westward from Munay which we are informed, he unsatisfactory on account of the topronrap?
ical features of the country after reaching a distance of about tweat! miles west af this place.
We are informed that the grading on the Valley is making very good progress, being completed. with the exception of small gaps between diferent coutracts, to withabout seven mile of Munday, aise that much better progres has been made on the Brazos River bridbe at at Seymour than the contractor expected would be made during winter, and now that he expects to have the brsdge completed long before his time limit.
