#### ABOUT THE WICHITA VALLEY Probable That a Branch Line Will be Built Out of Mlaskel.

We are informed from reliable rources that Col. Margan Jones, president of the Wichita Valle; Railway Co. will be here in a few days with his cheif engine for the purpose of prospecting a railroad west from Haskell over which to build a branch of his road into the plains country, after the completion of the extension nowin progress to Standford via this place.

Col. Jones has already prospected a line westward from Munuay which we are informed, he unsatisfactory on account of the topograpa ical features of the country after reaching a distance of about twenty miles west af this place.

We are informed that the grading on the Valley is making very good progress, being completed. with the exception of small gaps between diferent contracts, to withabout seven mile of Munday, also that much better progres has been made on the Brazos River bridbe at at Seymour than the contractor expected would be made during winter, and now that he expects to have the brsdge completed long before his time limit. Should this be the case, construction trains can cross the river so much sooner and thus hasten the work of the intire line--Haskell Free Press.
