## Texas to go Into

Mining Business
Austin, Texas, Feb. 3rd The State of Texas is to go in he mining business if a bill introduced by representative Eugene Harris and others of EI Paso becomes a law. The bill prpvides or a leasing system through which all the mineral lands own-
ed by the State may be develed by the State may be devel
oped by the mining operators oped by the mining operators
paying a royalty of five per cent paying a royalty of five per cent
of the gross receipts from the sale of the output of each mine into the treasury of the State. The bill takes in every kind of product known in the minera kingdom. It will especially re lieve the metal-bearing territory of West Texas and provide ortunities for expansion.
The State owns $1,750,000$ acres of land and at least 90 per cent of it contains minerals in unent law gives the mineral pros ector no rights and there is no ncentive for development. The ands in question have little or
no value for agricultual purposes.
