Never before in the histoty o Texas has the building of fortysix miles of railroad opened up for ettlement so large an area of high lass agricultural lazd.
In Dawson county alone there are more than 500,000 acres of ag. ricultural land. To the north of us and to the east there are whole counties which will be fifty mile nearer a railroad upon the ccmpletion of this road to $L$ imesa.
