The History of Lynn County, Texas
prepared and read by Miss Gilmore of Tahoka, at the Teachers' Institute.
Lyna County was created by an act of the Legislature in 1876 , and was attached to the following counties for judicial purposes: Young county Ang, 21, 1876 Throckmorton, Feb. 25, 1881 Howard Mar. 27, 1883, Crosb Feb, 18, 1889 , Lubbock 1891.
The nane Lynn was given it in honor of George W. Lynu who was killed in the Alamo
Lynn County is 30 mile; square giving it an area of goo square miles.
The last census taken was in 900 and gave Ls un a population of 17 , while the present $p$ pulation is something over 2000 .
Lynn County was mostly stockraising country until the last few jears, but stockraising is fast giving way to farming; corn, cot ton, maize, Kaffir corn, cane, mil let, oats and most all kiad of vegetables and fruits can be grown profitably.

There what the name should be, but the in me Tahoka was finally chosen fir the new town. We get the
natie Tahoka from a large lake six miles north of town by that name.

In with !rawing from Lubbock Lyen brought with it about $\$ 7000$ this being the amount of taxes she had to her credit. This gave us s mething to start to housekeeping on. We had money to bui!d court house and carry on the businass of the County without going in debt. We will put in a word for our commissioners here, they have finauced the County up to the present date without going in delt. So we havn't any Lym County bonds out, we will also add here that Lynn script is worth 100 cents on the dollar
