Insomuch as the residence is a brick bungalow, this type of mall receives is most | MAKING USE OF LIMESTONE <br> Interesting Results of Professor True- <br> man's Experiments on Nova Scotia College Farry. <br> In regard to the use of limestone, he results of Professor Iruemanis sxperiments on the Nova Scotia colege farm are of interest. One experiment was with clover, two halt acre plots of which averaged $11 / 4$ tons more claver per acre on limed areas than on adjoining unlimed plots. However, on a very rich piece of land where the same experiment was tried practically no difference was noted, and ©n the very poor areas the differ rence was very small indeed. <br> Practically all the soil on the college farm gives a slight acid reaction to the litmus test, as do most solls in Nova Scotia which have been inestigated by the college, chemist This indicates the necessity of liming <br> That the college management believe in their experiments is indicated by the fact that they are this year ap plying to various fields upwards of 150 tons of ground limestone. Provided the material can be purchased reason ably enough they do not hesitate to advise any farmer in Nova Scotia who is trying permanently build up fertility of his farm to use ground lime stone at the rate of three to four tons per acre. | Coatrary, beiwerer, to a sood many statements which have appeared elsewhere, the college management point out tise fact that these striking re sults from the application of ground limestone have been on the lighter, sandier solls from which analysis show the limestone has in the course of years: been leeched out. <br> FOODS AFFECT EGG QUALI! <br> Onions and Cabbage Have Direst in fiuence on Flaver-Corn Causee Deep Yellow in Yolk. <br> Careful experiments indicate tha the foods eaten by hens may affec egg quality. For example, green foods and yellow corn seem to cause a deet coler in the yolk, whils the use white cern, wheat and buckwheat sults in pale yolks. Birds on fret range lay eggs that have more cole than these frem hens kept yarder without erercise:- Fscessive amount, of green feod are thought to produce eggs of marked odor and faver onions and cabbage having a direct in fuence in this respect. <br> Vegetabies for Hens. <br> Turnips, pumpkins, parings, etc., art eaten with greater relish by the hent when they are cooked, thoroughly mixed with a mash and fed steamlag hot. |
