As we have said, the water engineers have been mindful of will be delivered into a surface reservoir. This reservoir will act as a settling basin, allowing the sand to be separated from the water. This reservoir will be coustructed of concrete, beance can be reduced to the ing 28 feet in diameter by 12 feet deep, and having a capacity of 50,000 gallons. It will be neatly covered, which will prevent trash and dirt from blowing into the water.

The water will be taken from this reservoir by a triplex pump, which will have an oil engine for its motive power, and delivered into an overhead steel tank and tower. This tank and tower will be constructed of steel, being elevated 100 feet from the foundations to top of tank. It will have a capacity of 50,000 gallons of water, with a hemispherical bottom and columns, setting on foundations




