Tahoka School Opens.

The Tahoka free school opened Monday with an attendance of 45 in the primary department and 40 in the advanced grades. This is quite an increase over the opening day last year; which shows that our population is not only greatly increased, but that the interest of our people in the education of their children is as keen as ever and increasing all the time.

The new addition to the school-building, when completed, will nearly double its seating capacity and somewhat relieve the crowded condition which has prevailed there in the time past. However, we hope that this addition is only a temporary make-shift, and that next year our people will find some way to erect a schoolhouse which will be more in keeping with the wealth and good taste of the community than the present structure. The bell has been hung in its place and the pupils will now have no excuse for being late.

Education is the greatest safeguard of free government, and the school and its success should be very near and dear to the hearts of our people. Each parent should strive to help rather than hinder the teachers in their work of teaching and governing the school. Any teacher of average ability can teach a very satisfactory school if he can depend upon receiving the co-operation and sympathy of the parents; failing to receive which, his work will be largely a failure, no matter how well qualified he is as an instructor.

As a matter of fact, our boys and girls do not sufficiently appreciate their opportunities for getting an education until they are gone forever. In a little newspaper edited and printed by convicts in the Ohio penitentiary, the statement is made that a boy's time in school is worth \$10 a day. For, when a boy has spent 12 years of 180 days each in school, his average yearly earnings for the next 40 years will amount to \$1000, while the boy who grows up without an education earns an average of but \$450 a year for the length of time. Multiply each average annual salary by 40, find the difference between the products and divide the difference in 40 years salary by 2160 [number of days in 12 years of school] and the quotient will be the value of one day of school, so we see the convict editor was more than right.

What a boy or girl learns in

school depends more on their desire for knowledge than the style of desks used or the way the teacher parts his hair. Where there is a will, there is a way; and if both pupils and parents will give Pro-

fessor Walker and Miss Chambers the proper amount of sympathy and encouragement in their efforts toward that end, we cannot fail to have a real successful school in Tahoka the ensuing term.




