When he does this it will make fine homes for a number of good families-just what we need-and it would be big money to a number of other ranchers to follow the example this man telks of setting. - Avalanche.

That territory is no better farming country than this right here, but they have encouraged the small farmer to come there more than we have; hence the difference in the growth of the towns named.


