Contractors Tell Us They Will Finish the School House Basement Walls This Week—Brick To Be Rushed.

Contracter Casler tells us that they will probably finish the basement walls to the new \$16,000 school building this week. These outside walls are concrete to the level of the ground and then are built of four courses of brick which will be covered with cement nicely finished. The inside walls are of concrete to the first floor. This certainly a massive structure and nothing less than an earthquake will have any effect on it. The doors and window frames are bedded in cement making wind and water tight joints.
