**DEATH OF TWO VETERAN NEWS-PAPER MEN**

It is with deep regret that the News chronicles the death of two pioneer newspaper men of Texas.—Col. J. H. Hamner, of Claude, and John W. Dale of Robstown, both of whom passed over the Great Divide during the past week.

For more than thirty-five years these two veteran soldiers of the old school, have been prominent editors of newspapers in different portions of the state. They have given to the people of Texas such high ideals and lofty thoughts as rarely come from the pen of journalists.

One by one these old veterans pass from earth to their reward. May their mantle fall on the younger generation of editors inspiring them to the high ideals for which they wrote and labored.

It gives us unusual sorrow to chronicle of these two noble men as our early days in the printing business was spent under their instruction, and to their fatherly advice and kindly criticism we owe much of what we have achieved in the newspaper work today.

### Conditions Justify Thirty Cent Cotton

Geo. B. Terrell, commissioner of Agriculture, reviews the cotton situation and urges bankers, merchants and farmers not to force cotton upon the market, depressing the price and causing heavy losses to the producer.

He says: "The average cost of producing this cotton crop is estimated to be 22c per pound. The spot market is below this price now, and cotton has lost more than five dollars per bale in the last few days, caused by the rapid gathering and selling of the Texas crop.

"This crop is several million bales short of the world's needs, and every condition justifies a price of thirty cents.

"I appeal to the farmers, merchants and bankers, not to force all the cotton upon a declining market, causing lower prices, and the loss of millions of dollars so badly needed to pay the farmers' debts and revive the business of this country.

"The total crop of the south last year was 8,039,673 bales. The domestic consumption and exports for the year just closed are 11,799,381 bales, or nearly four million bales more than was produced last year. The big surplus of 1920 is practically used up. The crop this year will probably not reach ten million bales, or nearly two million bales less than consumption this year.

"Nothing could keep the price of cotton from going to 30c, if it were not dumped upon the market as fast as picked.

"Don't take my word for it. Consider the facts I have given and take the word of P. H. Naughton, a cotton manufacturer, as published in the Daily News Record of New York.

"He says: 'All cotton growing countries indicate poor crops—cotton famine is inevitable. The whole world wants cotton. The world is hungry for cotton goods. Middling cotton will sell for 30 cents before the beautiful snow flies.'

"In view of these undisputed facts, it seems to me that the business interests of Texas and the South, which must depend upon cotton for existence could not afford to force this crop upon the market at prices less than cost, causing a loss of millions of dollars to the farmers and all interests dependent upon the cotton crop. As soon as pressing debts are paid, all interests should unite to stop the rapid sale of cotton and the price would reach 30c in 30 days if the sale of cotton could be stopped that long."—Southwest Plainsman.

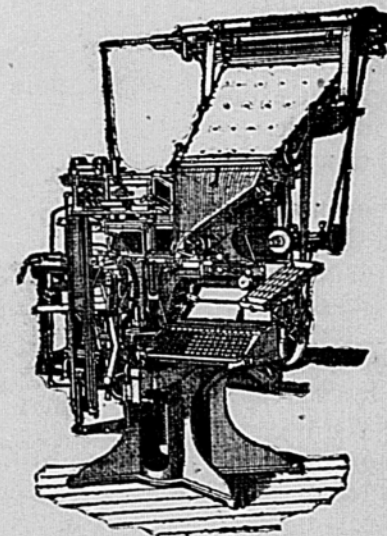

### REV. J. H. HUNT RETURNS FROM DALLAS FRIDAY

Rev. James H. Hunt returned from Dallas Friday, where he had been attending the Seventy-five Million Dollar convention that met there the first of last week to plan for the 1922 drive. This is the third year of the campaign to raise this enormous amount that the Baptist people have pledged themselves to raise in five years. So far, Rev. Hunt informs us, the drive each year has gone over the top, and they expect this to be one of the best years of the work.

The campaign is a pledge made by Southern Baptist people from 18 states to raise this amount of money for churches, schools, hospitals, etc. Texas has pledged within itself, about twenty million dollars of this sum and the last two years they have gone over the proportionate amount, and he thinks this year will go above any previous year.

This meeting was attended by all pastors of Texas and laymen, the latter financing the meeting, which cost them around four thousand dollars, but was made up by the laymen within a very short time.

Rev. Hunt thinks the fifth and last year of the drive will place them beyond the goal, possible a total of one hundred million dollars.—Abernathy Review.
