## Motley County ISD receives Telecommunications Grant

 PECAN NUT CASEBEARER The pecan crop last year waspoor over much of the Rolling Plains. This was due in part to the hot, dry
conditions that prevailed during conditions that prevailed during
much of the spring and summer Since pecans are alternate bearing, especially when the trees are older,

area is in need of a good rain. Trees should be inspected to determine the
probability of producing an economical crop and to determine if pecan
nut casebearer control is needed. The catkins or male blooms are very
apparent on many trees and the feapparent on many trees and the fe-
male blooms or small nutlets have been or soon will be set on the end of new growth. The pecan nut casebearer and
the pean weevil are the two pest
that cause most of the damage to the that cause most of the damage eto the
developing pecan crop. Pecan nut developing pecan crop. Pecan nut ing the first generation which occurs from late May through June. Pecan weevil adults do not emerge from the
soil until mid-August or later and ofen are delayed because they emerge after a rain or when the orchard is irrigated. The eggs of pecan weevils
that develop in the pecans as larvae, are deposited in pecans from the pecan gel stage until the shell is too hard for the weevils to gnaw through. The time to control the pecan nut
casebearer is usually from May 25 to June 5 .
