## Desert Storm Vets to be honored during Motley County Centennial Celebration

Known veterans of the Desert Storm campaign with connection to Motley County have been invited to the Centennial Celebration on May 25, 1991. Friends and relatives are urged to also contact these soldiers in case those invitations are lost in the shuffle of returning to their home bases.

Invitations have been sent to Lance Corporal Shannon Vinson, Mark Guerrero, Sgt. Myron G. Bethard Jr., PFC Scott Evans, Sgt. Mark Mullins, SPEC Jamal Rhinehardt, and SSgt. Jesus L. Zarate to join the historical parade and the patriotic program.

Sixteen members of the Centennial Celebration Committee, met on March 25 to discuss other business. Excitement is growing as plans fall into place and steady progress is made for the 100th anniversary of the county's organization.

The Brands for Beef project is off to a good start. Twenty-three ranchers have already responded with donations of \$50

or more which will buy beef for the barbecue and defray other expenses. Those residents with registered brands who wish to participate in the branding may contact Nova Dell Turner for more information.

Orders of commemorative coins of either bronze for \$10 each or silver for \$20 each should be placed as soon as possible. Prepayment for the coins should be made as soon as possible to Loys Campbell or Charles Cammack to insure an order.

Immediate projects include billboard type advertising signs on the highways into Matador, posters, and the program-booklets. Good progress is reported on the fiddlers contest, the washer pitch, the barbecue, the parade, the buckskinners, and the senior citizens games. However, the children's contests and games are threatened with cancellation unless more interest is shown and help forthcoming.

Sponsors are needed for children's game booths, similar to those set up for Halloween carnivals. Individuals or groups interested in making money in this manner may call Judy Cooper for ideas or Joy Archer for a booth assignment.

Clubs are urged to start thinking about and planning their floats for the parade.

Nora Bell Dunning reported that an old fashioned Singing Convention will be held Sunday, May 26 at 2:00 p.m.

The Parade of Bands on March 30 promises an exciting evening of entertainment and food at the High School. Earlyne Jameson has been in charge of planning this fund raising event for the

American Heart Assn. Motley County FFA will have a concession stand.

On April 27, a "fun run", Roaring Springs first annual Splash and Dash will challenge runners with a beautiful and challenging contest and provide spectators with a chance to urge their favorites on to victory. Both the 10k and the 2 mile run start at 9 a.m. so be in place early.

Motley County Students of all ages will also be involved in an essay contest and some will be entering art for competition. Both of these contest will have themes that relate to the celebration.

## Motley County PTO Has Drug-Alcohol Awareness Program

Terree Donaldson called the third meeting of the PTO to order and she thanked everyone for coming to the meeting.

They began the meeting with reading of the minutes by Renee Meyer, Secretary of PTO. The Treasurer's report was given by President Donaldson, due to Bunny Speed being out of town.

Committee reports were given, beginning with Little Dribblers. The Little Dribblers Tournament is scheduled for March 28-30. The Father-Son Banquet was next for discussion. The Banquet date is April 16 at 7:00 p.m. in the school gym. The committee's are busy getting everything ready for the event. Next on the agenda was "Project Graduation". Planning on this project is now underway. The help and support has been very good from teachers, parents and community. So far, the donations total \$224.00 for the graduation party. President Donaldson and Executive officers extended their appreciation to the plaque committee for a job well done. The committee was responsible for a plaque honoring Mr. Donald Ewing. The plaque is hanging outside the teachers lounge for those who have not seen it.

Moving to new business the executive officers presented th PTO with giving a Senior UIL contestant a \$100.00 Scholarship. This would be an on-going thing from year to year, presented to the student by the PTO. President Donaldson also read a thank you note from Carol Hays for all the PTO's hard work to help the drama department this year.

Meeting adjourned and the program on Drug-Alcohol Abuse was presented by Terry Braddock of Central Plains MHMR of Plainview. Mr. Braddock stated that substance abuse is the number one health problem in America. Fifty percent of car fatalities are alcohol related. Most of the males in the 14-17 year age bracket that die are in alcohol related car accidents. Also one out of 10 adults are addicted to alcohol. Mr. Braddock defined an alcoholic as anyone whose drinking causes problems. These problems include divorce, family trouble, loss of a job or health problems. Children of alcoholic parents drink because their needs are not being met by the alcoholic parent.

Drug use, nation wide is down by 12%, stated Mr. Braddock, but there has been an increase in the usage of 3 drugs. These are alcohol, cocaine and inhalants. The average age to start experimenting with drugs and alcohol is 12 1/2 years. In the 15 to 17 year age bracket, there has been a 400% increase in drug abuse.

Talking with your children and setting a good example are two of the most important things you can do for your children to help them say no to drugs and alcohol. Mr. Braddock urges anyone with a drug or alcohol problem to seek help. Anyone seeking help will not be turned away. Help is free for those with the inability to pay. Chemical addiction is a serious problem for adults and most certainly for our children. Keep the lines of communication open and don't be afraid to seek help. You could save a life.

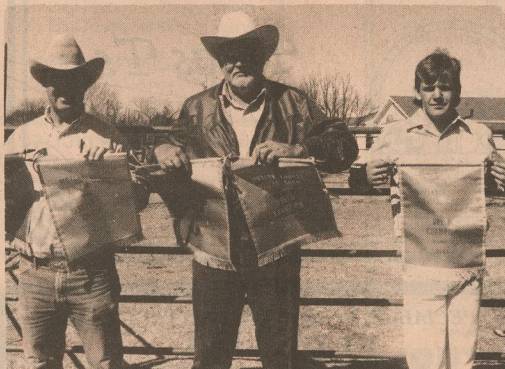

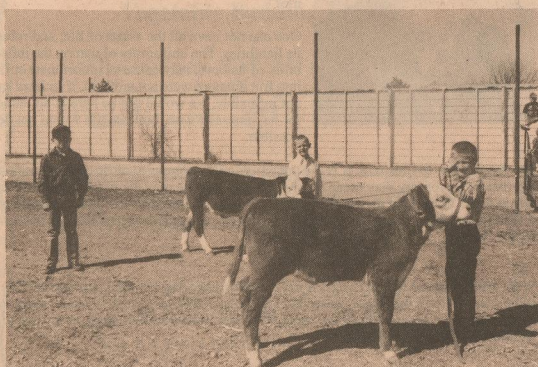


