## A Message Of Importance

For the past many years, the funeral home in Matador has assumed the responsibility of operating an ambulance service for the citizens of this area. For the past five years continuance of the ambulance service has been possible only with the financial assistance of Motley County and the City of Matador, but the responsibility for its operation has still remained at the funeral home.

This will be a difficult problem to solve, but our city and county officials are working hard to find an efficient means of providing ambulance service for the residents.

Until such time as an alternate ambulance service is worked out, please feel free to continue to call the funeral home if you need help. Although we cannot make the call personally, we will locate someone qualified to help you. The telephone number for ambulance service will be changed in the very near future, but until that time, we will be glad to take all calls and refer them to the proper people.

We want to take this opportunity to thank everyone for heir concern during my illness, and the assistance of friends and business associates who have made it possible to continue with both the funeral home and ambulance service during this period of convalescence.
